### Definitions of "Spoke" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “spoke” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Support consisting of a radial member of a wheel joining the hub to the rim.*
- *Each of the bars or wire rods connecting the centre of a wheel to its outer edge.*
- *Each of the metal rods in an umbrella to which the material is attached.*
- *Each of a set of radial handles projecting from a ship's wheel.*
- *One of the crosspieces that form the steps of a ladder.*



## Synonyms of "Spoke" as a noun (22 Words)

- batten** Stuffing made of rolls or sheets of cotton wool or synthetic fiber.
- beam** An oscillating shaft which transmits the vertical piston movement of a beam engine to the crank or pump.  
*The detector simply pinpoints the radar **beams** that other ships transmit.*
- boom** A loud, deep, resonant sound.  
*The **boom** of the bittern may be enjoyed in the country.*
- crosspiece** A horizontal beam that extends across something.  
*Tall pillars of brick with wooden **crosspieces**.*
- girder** A beam made usually of steel; a main support in a structure.  
*The tower is made of steel **girders** criss crossed to make it stronger.*
- pale** A wooden strip forming part of a fence.
- paling** A post used in a paling.

<b>pole</b>	A long fiberglass sports implement used for pole vaulting. <i>New <b>poles</b> should be protected from grazing livestock.</i>
<b>prop</b>	A propeller that rotates to push against air. <i>He found himself becoming the emotional <b>prop</b> of the marriage.</i>
<b>radius</b>	A circular region whose area is indicated by the length of its radius. <i>There are plenty of local pubs within a two mile <b>radius</b>.</i>
<b>rail</b>	A bar or pair of parallel bars of rolled steel making the railway along which railroad cars or other vehicles can roll. <i>A curtain <b>rail</b>.</i>
<b>rod</b>	A square rod of land. <i>The roof is formed of willow and hazel <b>rods</b> woven between willow rafters.</i>
<b>rundle</b>	One of the crosspieces that form the steps of a ladder.
<b>rung</b>	One of the crosspieces that form the steps of a ladder. <i>We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom <b>rung</b>.</i>
<b>shaft</b>	A vertical passageway through a building (as for an elevator). <i>The <b>shaft</b> of a feather.</i>
<b>shank</b>	The shank of an animal's leg as a cut of meat. <i>A rigid leather boot with a full <b>shank</b>.</i>
<b>spar</b>	Any of various nonmetallic minerals calcite or feldspar that are light in color and transparent or translucent and cleavable.
<b>stake</b>	A pole or stake set up to mark something as the start or end of a race track. <i>Bishop Ridley was burned at the <b>stake</b>.</i>
<b>stick</b>	In field hockey the foul play of raising the stick above the shoulder. <i>Fever left him weak on his <b>sticks</b>.</i>
<b>strut</b>	Brace consisting of a bar or rod used to resist longitudinal compression. <i>A spindly framework of long slender <b>struts</b> girders and bracing wire.</i>
<b>support</b>	A musical part vocal or instrumental that supports or provides background for other musical parts. <i>The team enjoyed the <b>support</b> of their fans.</i>
<b>wheel spoke</b>	Game equipment consisting of a wheel with slots that is used for gambling; the wheel rotates horizontally and players bet on which slot the roulette ball will stop in.



## Associations of "Spoke" (30 Words)

**automobile** Travel in an automobile.

**axle** A rod or spindle (either fixed or rotating) passing through the centre of a wheel or group of wheels.  
*North American railways operate cars at much higher **axle** loads.*

**bicycle** Ride a bicycle.  
*They spent the holidays bicycling around the beautiful Devonshire countryside.*

**bike** Ride a bicycle or motorcycle.  
*I'll get them to **bike** the scripts over.*

**cycle** A ride on a bicycle.  
*A year constitutes a **cycle** of the seasons.*

**cycling** The sport or activity of riding a bicycle. Cycle racing has three main forms: road racing (typically over long distances), pursuit (on an oval track), and cyclo-cross (over rough, open country).

**cyclist** A person who rides a bicycle.

**drive** Hitting a golf ball off of a tee with a driver.  
*Cattle were no longer taken on long **drives** but were delivered by rail.*

**driver** A golfer who hits the golf ball with a driver.  
*A taxi **driver**.*

<b>freewheel</b>	Coast in a vehicle using the freewheel. <i>She was convinced that she saved a lot of petrol money by turning the engine off and <b>freewheeling</b> down the hill.</i>
<b>hub</b>	The effective centre of an activity, region, or network. <i>The airport is the economic <b>hub</b> of the area.</i>
<b>log</b>	Enter into a log as on ships and planes. <i>They kept a <b>log</b> of all transmission by the radio station.</i>
<b>motor</b>	Relating to motor vehicles. <i><b>Motor</b> energy.</i>
<b>motorcycle</b>	Ride a motorcycle.
<b>motorist</b>	The driver of a car.
<b>mounted</b>	Decorated with applied ornamentation; often used in combination. <i>The trim brass <b>mounted</b> carbine of the ranger.</i>
<b>pedal</b>	Operate the pedals on a keyboard instrument. <i>He was coming down the path on his bike <b>pedalling</b> hard.</i>
<b>pulley</b>	Hoist with a pulley. <i>The tree house was built on the ground and <b>pulleyed</b> into the branches.</i>
<b>ride</b>	A mechanical device that you ride for amusement or excitement. <i>If you don't give all the kids a chance to play the parents <b>ride</b> you.</i>
<b>rider</b>	A traveler who actively rides an animal (as a horse or camel). <i>She was a skilled <b>rider</b>.</i>
<b>riding</b>	The sport or activity of riding horses. <i><b>Riding</b> is an exhilarating experience.</i>
<b>rung</b>	A crosspiece between the legs of a chair. <i>We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom <b>rung</b>.</i>
<b>scooter</b>	Travel or ride on a scooter. <i>A snow <b>scooter</b>.</i>
<b>skateboard</b>	Ride on a skateboard. <i>Teenagers in Day Glo shorts <b>skateboard</b> home from an evening out.</i>
<b>streetcar</b>	A tram.
<b>surrey</b>	A light four-wheeled horse-drawn carriage; has two or four seats.
<b>tram</b>	Travel by tram. <i>A <b>tramcar</b> carries coal out of a coal mine.</i>
<b>tricycle</b>	Ride on a tricycle. <i>A small boy <b>tricycled</b> to the end of his driveway.</i>
