- Support consisting of a radial member of a wheel joining the hub to the rim.
- Each of the bars or wire rods connecting the centre of a wheel to its outer edge.
- Each of the metal rods in an umbrella to which the material is attached.
- Each of a set of radial handles projecting from a ship's wheel.
- One of the crosspieces that form the steps of a ladder.





Synonyms of "Spoke" as a noun (22 Words)

batten	Stuffing made of rolls or sheets of cotton wool or synthetic fiber.
<u>beam</u>	An oscillating shaft which transmits the vertical piston movement of a beam engine to the crank or pump. The detector simply pinpoints the radar beam s that other ships transmit.
<u>boom</u>	A loud, deep, resonant sound. The boom of the bittern may be enjoyed in the country.
crosspiece	A horizontal beam that extends across something. Tall pillars of brick with wooden crosspiece s.
girder	A beam made usually of steel; a main support in a structure. The tower is made of steel girder s criss crossed to make it stronger.
<u>pale</u>	A wooden strip forming part of a fence.
paling	A post used in a paling.



pole	A long fiberglass sports implement used for pole vaulting. New pole s should be protected from grazing livestock.
prop	A propeller that rotates to push against air. He found himself becoming the emotional prop of the marriage.
radius	A circular region whose area is indicated by the length of its radius. There are plenty of local pubs within a two mile radius .
rail	A bar or pair of parallel bars of rolled steel making the railway along which railroad cars or other vehicles can roll. A curtain rail .
rod	A square rod of land. The roof is formed of willow and hazel rod s woven between willow rafters.
rundle	One of the crosspieces that form the steps of a ladder.
rung	One of the crosspieces that form the steps of a ladder. We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom rung .
shaft	A vertical passageway through a building (as for an elevator. The shaft of a feather.
shank	The shank of an animal s leg as a cut of meat. A rigid leather boot with a full shank .
spar	Any of various nonmetallic minerals calcite or feldspar that are light in color and transparent or translucent and cleavable.
<u>stake</u>	A pole or stake set up to mark something as the start or end of a race track. <i>Bishop Ridley was burned at the stake</i> .
stick	In field hockey the foul play of raising the stick above the shoulder. <i>Fever left him weak on his sticks.</i>
strut	Brace consisting of a bar or rod used to resist longitudinal compression. A spindly framework of long slender strut s girders and bracing wire.
support	A musical part vocal or instrumental that supports or provides background for other musical parts. The team enjoyed the support of their fans.
wheel spoke	Game equipment consisting of a wheel with slots that is used for gambling; the wheel rotates horizontally and players bet on which slot the roulette ball will stop in.

automobile Travel in an automobile.

axle	A rod or spindle (either fixed or rotating) passing through the centre of a wheel or group of wheels. North American railways operate cars at much higher axle loads.

<u>hub</u>	The effective centre of an activity, region, or network. <i>The airport is the economic</i> hub <i>of the area.</i>
<u>log</u>	Enter into a log as on ships and planes. They kept a log of all transmission by the radio station.
motor	Relating to motor vehicles. Motor energy.
motorcycle	Ride a motorcycle.
motorist	The driver of a car.
mounted	Decorated with applied ornamentation; often used in combination. <i>The trim brass mounted carbine of the ranger.</i>
pedal	Operate the pedals on a keyboard instrument. <i>He was coming down the path on his bike pedalling hard.</i>
pulley	Hoist with a pulley. The tree house was built on the ground and pulley ed into the branches.
<u>ride</u>	A mechanical device that you ride for amusement or excitement. If you don t give all the kids a chance to play the parents ride you.
rider	A traveler who actively rides an animal (as a horse or camel. She was a skilled rider .
riding	The sport or activity of riding horses. Riding is an exhilarating experience.
rung	A crosspiece between the legs of a chair. We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom rung .
scooter	Travel or ride on a scooter. A snow scooter .
skateboard	Ride on a skateboard. Teenagers in Day Glo shorts skateboard home from an evening out.
streetcar	A tram.
surrey	A light four-wheeled horse-drawn carriage; has two or four seats.
tram	Travel by tram. A tram car carries coal out of a coal mine.
tricycle	Ride on a tricycle. A small boy tricycle d to the end of his driveway.



<u>vehicle</u>	A thing used for transporting people or goods, especially on land, such as a car, lorry, or cart.
