

A creation spoken or written or composed extemporaneously (without

improvisation prior preparation.

Improvisation is a performer s greatest creative act.

improvisedDone or made using whatever is available; makeshift.

We slept on **improvised** beds.

innocence The state, quality, or fact of being innocent of a crime or offence.

They must prove their **innocence**.

Relating to or prompted by instinct; done without conscious thought.

involuntary Done without will or conscious control.

musical Characterized by or capable of producing music.

naturalness The quality or state of being natural.

He accepted the **naturalness** of death.
