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

Spots as a Noun

Definitions of "Spots" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “spots” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A small contrasting part of something.*
- *A job in an organization.*
- *A playing card with a specified number of pips on it to indicate its value.*
- *A mark on a die or on a playing card (shape depending on the suit).*
- *An act that brings discredit to the person who does it.*
- *A blemish made by dirt.*
- *A business establishment for entertainment.*
- *A short section or illustration (as between radio or tv programs or in a magazine) that is often used for advertising.*
- *A small piece or quantity of something.*
- *A point located with respect to surface features of some region.*
- *A lamp that produces a strong beam of light to illuminate a restricted area; used to focus attention of a stage performer.*
- *Spots before the eyes caused by opaque cell fragments in the vitreous humor and lens.*
- *A section of an entertainment that is assigned to a specific performer or performance.*
- *A slight attack of illness.*
- *An outstanding characteristic.*



Synonyms of "Spots" as a noun (3 Words)

floater	A voter who votes illegally at different polling places in the same election. <i>Floaters seem to drift through the field of vision.</i>
musca volitans	Spots before the eyes caused by opaque cell fragments in the vitreous humor and lens.
muscae volitantes	Spots before the eyes caused by opaque cell fragments in the vitreous humor and lens.



Associations of "Spots" (30 Words)

- acne** An inflammatory disease involving the sebaceous glands of the skin; characterized by papules or pustules or comedones.
*He was clean shaven with a face that had been ravaged by **acne** when younger.*
- blemish** Add a flaw or blemish to make imperfect or defective.
*A facial **blemish**.*
- blob** An indistinct shapeless form.
*Her nose was **blobbed** with paint.*
- blot** Dry ink with blotting paper.
*Wind power turbines are a **blot** on the landscape.*
- dappled** Marked with spots or rounded patches.
*The horse s **dappled** flank.*

daub	Material used to daub walls. <i>The walls were daubed with splashes of paint.</i>
deface	Mar or spoil the appearance of. <i>Scars defaced her cheeks.</i>
dirt	Excrement. <i>A dirt road.</i>
disfigure	Spoil the appearance of. <i>Litter disfigures the countryside.</i>
dot	Place a dot over a letter. <i>OUP dot com.</i>
fleck	A small contrasting part of something. <i>The minarets are flecked with gold leaf.</i>
motley	Make motley color with different colors. <i>A jester dressed in motley.</i>
mottled	Marked with spots or smears of colour. <i>A bird with mottled brown plumage.</i>
patterned	Decorated with a repeated design; having a pattern or patterns. <i>She wore leather trousers and a patterned shirt.</i>
piebald	A piebald horse. <i>A piebald horse.</i>
pied	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly. <i>The pied flycatcher.</i>
pimple	A small hard inflamed spot on the skin. <i>I can see the hut down there just a tiny pimple.</i>
smear	Cover a surface by smearing a substance over it. <i>Soon you re eyeballing the top just one smear away.</i>
smirch	A dirty mark or stain. <i>I am not accustomed to having my honour smirched.</i>
smudge	Make a smudge on soil by smudging. <i>The low smudge of hills on the horizon.</i>
speck	Produce specks in or on. <i>The plane was just a speck in the sky.</i>
speckle	A small contrasting part of something. <i>Speckle the wall with tiny yellow spots.</i>
plotch	Mark with a blot or smear of something. <i>A plotch of red in a larger area of yellow.</i>

- spotted** Marked or decorated with spots.
*A black and white **spotted** cow.*
- stain** Produce or leave stains.
*The wine left a dark **stain**.*
- stained** (of a material or object) coloured by application of a penetrative dye or chemical.
*A **stained** beer mat.*
- striped** Marked or decorated with stripes.
*A green **striped** coat.*
- variegate** Make something more diverse and varied.
*The musicians **variegate** the pitch.*
- variegated** (of a plant or foliage) having or consisting of leaves that are edged or patterned in a second colour, especially white as well as green.
***Variegated** yellow bricks.*
- wart** An imperfection in someone or something that is suggestive of a wart especially in smallness or unattractiveness.
*Few products are without their **warts**.*
