Associations of "Spread out" (30 Words)

asunder	Widely separated especially in space. <i>As wide asunder as pole from pole.</i>
broad	Broad in scope or content. <i>Broad daylight.</i>
diffuse	Spread or diffuse through. <i>Oxygen molecules diffuse across the membrane.</i>
diffusion	The property of being diffused or dispersed. <i>The rapid diffusion of ideas and technology.</i>
dispel	To cause to separate and go in different directions. <i>The brightness of the day did nothing to dispel Elaine s dejection.</i>
dispersal	The act of dispersing or diffusing something. <i>Colleges had made large dispersals and the shops were filled with books.</i>
disperse	Denoting a phase dispersed in another phase as in a colloid. <i>The crowds dispersed.</i>
dispersed	Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. <i>Has ties with many widely dispersed friends.</i>
dispersion	The state of being dispersed. <i>The dispersion of the troops.</i>
disseminate	Spread (something, especially information) widely. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can disseminate and migrate.</i>
dissemination	The act of dispersing or diffusing something. <i>The dissemination of public information.</i>
dissipate	Move away from each other. <i>The cloud of smoke dissipated.</i>
distract	Divert (attention) from something. <i>Don t allow noise to distract you from your work.</i>

diversify	Vary in order to spread risk or to expand. <i>New plants will diversify the habitat.</i>
effluence	A substance that flows out from something.
imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably imbued with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
intersperse	Introduce one's writing or speech with certain expressions. <i>The debate was interspersed with angry exchanges.</i>
<u>permeate</u>	Spread throughout (something); pervade. <i>Water permeates sand easily.</i>
<u>pervade</u>	Spread or diffuse through. <i>A smell of stale cabbage pervaded the air.</i>
pervasiveness	The quality of filling or spreading throughout. <i>The pervasiveness of violence on television.</i>
proliferate	Cause (cells, tissue, structures, etc.) to reproduce rapidly. <i>Electromagnetic radiation can only proliferate cancers already present.</i>
<u>proliferation</u>	A rapid increase in number (especially a rapid increase in the number of deadly weapons). <i>We attempted to measure cell proliferation.</i>
<u>propagate</u>	Cause to propagate as by grafting or layering. <i>This great civilization was propagated throughout the land.</i>
<u>scatter</u>	The act of scattering. <i>Scatter the coconut over the icing.</i>
scattered	(of a person) distracted or disorganized. <i>A scattered clifftop community.</i>
<u>spray</u>	An act of spraying something. <i>Spray water on someone.</i>
spreading	The opening of a subject to widespread discussion and debate.
strew	Spread by scattering (is archaic). <i>A small room with newspapers strewn all over the floor.</i>
suffuse	Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. <i>The first half of the poem is suffused with idealism.</i>
<u>unfold</u>	Spread out or open from a closed or folded state. <i>There was a fascinating scene unfolding before me.</i>
