## Associations of "Spread out" (30 Words)

<a href="#">asunder</a>	Widely separated especially in space. <i>As wide <b>asunder</b> as pole from pole.</i>
<b>broad</b>	Broad in scope or content. <i><b>Broad</b> daylight.</i>
<a href="#">diffuse</a>	Spread or diffuse through. <i>Oxygen molecules <b>diffuse</b> across the membrane.</i>
<a href="#">diffusion</a>	The property of being diffused or dispersed. <i>The rapid <b>diffusion</b> of ideas and technology.</i>
<a href="#">dispel</a>	To cause to separate and go in different directions. <i>The brightness of the day did nothing to <b>dispel</b> Elaine s dejection.</i>
<b>dispersal</b>	The act of dispersing or diffusing something. <i>Colleges had made large <b>dispersals</b> and the shops were filled with books.</i>
<b>disperse</b>	Denoting a phase dispersed in another phase as in a colloid. <i>The crowds <b>dispersed</b>.</i>
<b>dispersed</b>	Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. <i>Has ties with many widely <b>dispersed</b> friends.</i>
<a href="#">dispersion</a>	The state of being dispersed. <i>The <b>dispersion</b> of the troops.</i>
<a href="#">disseminate</a>	Spread (something, especially information) widely. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can <b>disseminate</b> and migrate.</i>
<b>dissemination</b>	The act of dispersing or diffusing something. <i>The <b>dissemination</b> of public information.</i>
<b>dissipate</b>	Move away from each other. <i>The cloud of smoke <b>dissipated</b>.</i>
<b>distract</b>	Divert (attention) from something. <i>Don t allow noise to <b>distract</b> you from your work.</i>

<b>diversify</b>	Vary in order to spread risk or to expand. <i>New plants will <b>diversify</b> the habitat.</i>
<b>effluence</b>	A substance that flows out from something.
<b>imbue</b>	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably <b>imbued</b> with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
<b>intersperse</b>	Introduce one's writing or speech with certain expressions. <i>The debate was <b>interspersed</b> with angry exchanges.</i>
<b><u>permeate</u></b>	Spread throughout (something); pervade. <i>Water <b>permeates</b> sand easily.</i>
<b><u>pervade</u></b>	Spread or diffuse through. <i>A smell of stale cabbage <b>pervaded</b> the air.</i>
<b>pervasiveness</b>	The quality of filling or spreading throughout. <i>The <b>pervasiveness</b> of violence on television.</i>
<b>proliferate</b>	Cause (cells, tissue, structures, etc.) to reproduce rapidly. <i>Electromagnetic radiation can only <b>proliferate</b> cancers already present.</i>
<b><u>proliferation</u></b>	A rapid increase in number (especially a rapid increase in the number of deadly weapons). <i>We attempted to measure cell <b>proliferation</b>.</i>
<b><u>propagate</u></b>	Cause to propagate as by grafting or layering. <i>This great civilization was <b>propagated</b> throughout the land.</i>
<b><u>scatter</u></b>	The act of scattering. <i><b>Scatter</b> the coconut over the icing.</i>
<b>scattered</b>	(of a person) distracted or disorganized. <i>A <b>scattered</b> clifftop community.</i>
<b><u>spray</u></b>	An act of spraying something. <i><b>Spray</b> water on someone.</i>
<b>spreading</b>	The opening of a subject to widespread discussion and debate.
<b>strew</b>	Spread by scattering ( is archaic). <i>A small room with newspapers <b>strewn</b> all over the floor.</i>
<b>suffuse</b>	Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. <i>The first half of the poem is <b>suffused</b> with idealism.</i>
<b><u>unfold</u></b>	Spread out or open from a closed or folded state. <i>There was a fascinating scene <b>unfolding</b> before me.</i>
