Associations of "Spread the word" (30 Words)

asunder	Apart. <i>Those whom God hath joined together let no man put asunder.</i>
broad	Showing or characterized by broad mindedness. <i>Broad daylight.</i>
diffuse	Spread or diffuse through. <i>The problem is how to diffuse power without creating anarchy.</i>
diffusion	The spreading of something more widely. <i>The rate of diffusion of a gas.</i>
dispel	To cause to separate and go in different directions. <i>The brightness of the day did nothing to dispel Elaine s dejection.</i>
dispersal	The action or process of distributing or spreading things or people over a wide area. <i>Dispersals of archaic populations.</i>
disperse	Denoting a phase dispersed in another phase as in a colloid. <i>The crowds dispersed.</i>
dispersed	Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. <i>Has ties with many widely dispersed friends.</i>
dispersion	The spatial or geographic property of being scattered about over a range, area, or volume. <i>The dispersion of the troops.</i>
disseminate	Spread throughout an organ or the body. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can disseminate and migrate.</i>
dissemination	The action or fact of spreading something, especially information, widely. <i>The dissemination of public information.</i>
dissipate	Waste or fritter away (money, energy, or resources). <i>He wanted to dissipate his anger.</i>

diversify	Make (more) diverse. <i>Diversify a course of study.</i>
effluence	A substance that flows out from something.
imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably imbued with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
intersperse	Scatter among or between other things; place here and there. <i>The debate was interspersed with angry exchanges.</i>
lexicographer	A person who compiles dictionaries.
perfuse	Permeate or suffuse with a liquid, colour, or quality. <i>The isolated perfused rat liver.</i>
<u>permeate</u>	Penetrate mutually or be interlocked. <i>Water permeates sand easily.</i>
<u>pervade</u>	Spread or diffuse through. <i>A smell of stale cabbage pervaded the air.</i>
pervasiveness	The quality of spreading widely or being present throughout an area or a group of people. <i>The pervasiveness of violence on television.</i>
<u>proliferation</u>	A large number of something. <i>We attempted to measure cell proliferation.</i>
<u>scatter</u>	The scattering of light other electromagnetic radiation or particles. <i>Scatter seeds.</i>
scattered	Occurring or distributed over widely spaced and irregular intervals in time or space. <i>Scattered villages.</i>
<u>spray</u>	A pesticide in suspension or solution intended for spraying. <i>Water sprayed all over the floor.</i>
spreading	Act of extending over a wider scope or expanse of space or time.
<u>sprinkle</u>	The act of sprinkling or splashing water. <i>It began to sprinkle.</i>
strew	Scatter or spread (things) untidily over a surface or area. <i>The table was strewn with books and papers.</i>
suffuse	Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. <i>Her cheeks were suffused with colour.</i>
translator	A computer program that translates from one programming language into another. <i>The translator of Hardy's poems into Icelandic.</i>
