## Associations of "Spread the word" (30 Words)

<b><u>asunder</u></b>	Apart. <i>Those whom God hath joined together let no man put <b>asunder</b>.</i>
<b>broad</b>	Showing or characterized by broad mindedness. <i><b>Broad</b> daylight.</i>
<b><u>diffuse</u></b>	Spread or diffuse through. <i>The problem is how to <b>diffuse</b> power without creating anarchy.</i>
<b><u>diffusion</u></b>	The spreading of something more widely. <i>The rate of <b>diffusion</b> of a gas.</i>
<b><u>dispel</u></b>	To cause to separate and go in different directions. <i>The brightness of the day did nothing to <b>dispel</b> Elaine s dejection.</i>
<b>dispersal</b>	The action or process of distributing or spreading things or people over a wide area. <i><b>Dispersals</b> of archaic populations.</i>
<b>disperse</b>	Denoting a phase dispersed in another phase as in a colloid. <i>The crowds <b>dispersed</b>.</i>
<b>dispersed</b>	Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. <i>Has ties with many widely <b>dispersed</b> friends.</i>
<b><u>dispersion</u></b>	The spatial or geographic property of being scattered about over a range, area, or volume. <i>The <b>dispersion</b> of the troops.</i>
<b><u>disseminate</u></b>	Spread throughout an organ or the body. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can <b>disseminate</b> and migrate.</i>
<b>dissemination</b>	The action or fact of spreading something, especially information, widely. <i>The <b>dissemination</b> of public information.</i>
<b>dissipate</b>	Waste or fritter away (money, energy, or resources). <i>He wanted to <b>dissipate</b> his anger.</i>

<b>diversify</b>	Make (more) diverse. <i><b>Diversify</b> a course of study.</i>
<b>effluence</b>	A substance that flows out from something.
<b>imbue</b>	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably <b>imbued</b> with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
<b>intersperse</b>	Scatter among or between other things; place here and there. <i>The debate was <b>interspersed</b> with angry exchanges.</i>
<b>lexicographer</b>	A person who compiles dictionaries.
<b>perfuse</b>	Permeate or suffuse with a liquid, colour, or quality. <i>The isolated <b>perfused</b> rat liver.</i>
<a href="#"><u>permeate</u></a>	Penetrate mutually or be interlocked. <i>Water <b>permeates</b> sand easily.</i>
<a href="#"><u>pervade</u></a>	Spread or diffuse through. <i>A smell of stale cabbage <b>pervaded</b> the air.</i>
<b>pervasiveness</b>	The quality of spreading widely or being present throughout an area or a group of people. <i>The <b>pervasiveness</b> of violence on television.</i>
<a href="#"><u>proliferation</u></a>	A large number of something. <i>We attempted to measure cell <b>proliferation</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>scatter</u></a>	The scattering of light other electromagnetic radiation or particles. <i><b>Scatter</b> seeds.</i>
<b>scattered</b>	Occurring or distributed over widely spaced and irregular intervals in time or space. <i><b>Scattered</b> villages.</i>
<a href="#"><u>spray</u></a>	A pesticide in suspension or solution intended for spraying. <i>Water <b>sprayed</b> all over the floor.</i>
<b>spreading</b>	Act of extending over a wider scope or expanse of space or time.
<a href="#"><u>sprinkle</u></a>	The act of sprinkling or splashing water. <i>It began to <b>sprinkle</b>.</i>
<b>strew</b>	Scatter or spread (things) untidily over a surface or area. <i>The table was <b>strewn</b> with books and papers.</i>
<b>suffuse</b>	Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. <i>Her cheeks were <b>suffused</b> with colour.</i>
<b>translator</b>	A computer program that translates from one programming language into another. <i>The <b>translator</b> of Hardy s poems into Icelandic.</i>
