<b>commando</b>	A unit of commandos. <i>A <b>commando</b> attack.</i>
<b>company</b>	Organization of performers and associated personnel (especially theatrical). <i>I really enjoy his <b>company</b>.</i>
<b>coterie</b>	A small group of people with shared interests or tastes, especially one that is exclusive of other people. <i>A <b>coterie</b> of friends and advisers.</i>
<b>crew</b>	A group of people associated in some way. <i>The ship's captain and <b>crew</b> may be brought to trial.</i>
<b>crowd</b>	A large number of things or people considered together. <i>The <b>crowd</b> of tall buildings.</i>
<b>detachment</b>	A group of troops, aircraft, or ships sent away on a separate mission. <i>He felt a sense of <b>detachment</b> from what was going on.</i>
<b>detail</b>	A less significant item or fact. <i>We shall consider every <b>detail</b> of the Bill.</i>
<b>force</b>	The army navy and air force of a country. <i>They ruled by law and not by <b>force</b>.</i>
<b>gang</b>	An organized group of criminals. <i>The machine had a <b>gang</b> of cutter chains on a swivelling head.</i>
<b>group</b>	Two or more figures or objects forming a design. <i>I now belong to my local drama <b>group</b>.</i>
<b>mob</b>	The ordinary people. <i>My <b>mob</b> travelled and traded with other people.</i>
<b>outfit</b>	Any cohesive unit such as a military company. <i>Her wedding <b>outfit</b>.</i>
<b>patrol</b>	A detachment used for security or reconnaissance. <i>The police were on <b>patrol</b> when they were ordered to investigate the incident.</i>
<b>platoon</b>	Engaged in platooning. <i><b>Platoons</b> of sharp lawyers.</i>
<b>police squad</b>	The force of policemen and officers.
<b>ring</b>	The sound of a bell ringing E A Poe. <i>A boxing <b>ring</b>.</i>
<b>set</b>	Evil Egyptian god with the head of a beast that has high square ears and a long snout; brother and murderer of Osiris. <i>His instructions deliberately gave them the wrong <b>set</b>.</i>

<b>squadron</b>	A principal division of an armoured or cavalry regiment, consisting of two or more troops. <i>He immediately commissioned a <b>squadron</b> of architects.</i>
<b>team</b>	Used before another word to form the name of a real or notional group which supports or favours the person or thing indicated. <i><b>Team</b> members.</i>
<b>troop</b>	Soldiers or armed forces. <i>A <b>troop</b> of children.</i>

<b>chieftain</b>	The head of a tribe or clan. <i>An elite composed of corporate <b>chieftains</b>.</i>
<b>colonel</b>	A commissioned military officer in the United States Army or Air Force or Marines who ranks above a lieutenant colonel and below a brigadier general.
<b>command</b>	Be in command of. <i>This speaker <b>commands</b> a high fee.</i>
<b>commander</b>	A rank of naval officer above lieutenant commander and below captain. <i>The <b>commander</b> of a paratroop regiment.</i>
<b>contingent</b>	A group of people sharing a common feature, forming part of a larger group. <i>Arms sales <b>contingent</b> on the approval of congress.</i>
<b>corps</b>	A body of people associated together. <i>At 9 30 a m the press <b>corps</b> was handed what looked to be a routine list of orders.</i>
<b>deployment</b>	The action of bringing resources into effective action. <i>The authorities announced <b>deployment</b> of extra security forces in towns and cities to prevent violence.</i>
<b>dragoon</b>	A mounted infantryman armed with a carbine. <i>She had been <b>dragooned</b> into helping with the housework.</i>
<b>garrison</b>	Station troops in a fort or garrison. <i>Air reconnaissance showed the Germans had not <b>garrisoned</b> the island.</i>
<b>grenadier</b>	A common bottom-dwelling fish with a large head, a long tapering tail, and typically a luminous gland on the belly.
<b>leader</b>	A conductor of a small musical group. <i>The <b>leader</b> of a protest group.</i>
<b>legion</b>	A division of 3,000-6,000 men, including a complement of cavalry, in the ancient Roman army. <i>Her fans are <b>legion</b>.</i>
<b>legionary</b>	Of an ancient Roman legion. <i>The <b>legionary</b> fortress of Isca.</i>
<b>master</b>	Make a master copy of a film or recording. <i>A <b>master</b> of the violin.</i>
<b>militia</b>	Civilians trained as soldiers but not part of the regular army. <i>Small detachments of <b>militia</b>.</i>
<b>naval</b>	Relating to a navy or navies. <i>A <b>naval</b> base.</i>
<b>officer</b>	Direct or command as an officer. <i>A chief executive <b>officer</b>.</i>

<b>regiment</b>	Form military personnel into a regiment. <b>Regiment</b> soldiers.
<b>sergeant</b>	A rank of non commissioned officer in the army or air force above corporal and below staff sergeant.
<b>skipper</b>	Work as the skipper on a vessel. <i>The course teaches even complete beginners to <b>skipper</b> their own yachts.</i>
<b>soldier</b>	Serve as a soldier in the military. <i>Graham wasn't enjoying this but he <b>soldiered</b> on.</i>
<b>subaltern</b>	Inferior in rank or status. <i>The private tutor was a recognized <b>subaltern</b> part of the bourgeois family.</i>
<b>team</b>	Come together as a team to achieve a common goal. <i>The abbey's wagon and a <b>team</b> of horses are gone.</i>
<b>troop</b>	A group of soldiers. <b>Troop</b> cuts.
