Definitions of "Squelch" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "squelch" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *To compress with violence, out of natural shape or condition.*
- *Forcefully silence or suppress.*
- *Walk through mud or mire.*
- *Make a soft sucking sound such as that made by treading heavily through mud.*
- *Make a sucking sound.*
- *Suppress or crush completely.*

Synonyms of "Squelch" as a verb (22 Words)

crush Crush or bruise.

*I was **crushed** was I not good enough.*

end Be the end of be the last or concluding part of.

*My property **ends** by the bushes.*

extinguish Extinguish by crushing.

*The debt was absolutely **extinguished**.*

mash Crush or smash something to a pulp.

*The barley is dried out over peat fires and **mashed** with water which flows through peat ground.*

nip in the bud Sever or remove by pinching or snipping.

put a stop to Adapt.

put an end to Estimate.

put down	Formulate in a particular style or language.
quash	Declare invalid. <i>The government quashes any attempt of an uprising.</i>
quell	Subdue or silence (someone). <i>Extra police were called to quell the disturbance.</i>
quench	Reduce the degree of (luminescence or phosphorescence) in (excited molecules or a material) by adding a suitable substance. Quench a rebellion.
slop	Feed slops to an animal. <i>The indignity of slopping out.</i>
slosh	Make a splashing sound. <i>Why did you slosh me.</i>
splash	Mark or overlay with patches of contrasting color or texture cause to appear splashed or spattered. <i>The story was splashed across the front pages.</i>
splosh	Make a splashing sound. <i>We had to splosh across the wet meadow.</i>
squash	Make one's way into a small or restricted space. <i>She needled him with such venom that Seb was visibly squashed.</i>
squeeze	Squeeze tightly between the fingers. <i>He found a hole in the hedge and squeezed his way through.</i>
squish	Put (a liquid) into a container or another place by means of a squirting action. <i>Strawberries so ripe that they squished if picked too firmly.</i>
stamp out	Affix a stamp to.
stop	Stop moving or operating. <i>A campaign is under way to stop the bombers.</i>
subdue	Overcome, quieten, or bring under control (a feeling or person). Subdue one's appetites.
suppress	Prevent or inhibit (a process or reaction). <i>Use of the drug suppressed the immune response.</i>

Usage Examples of "Squelch" as a verb

- *Bedraggled guests squelched across the lawn to seek shelter.*
- *Squelch any sign of dissent.*
- *Property developers tried to squelch public protest.*

appease	Pacify or placate (someone) by acceding to their demands. <i>Amendments have been added to appease local pressure groups.</i>
clang	Make or cause to make a clang. <i>The bell of a fire engine clanged.</i>
compress	Express in a shorter form; abridge. <i>Compress the data.</i>
crush	The act of crushing. <i>The plastic bottle crushed against the wall.</i>
drop	An act of dropping supplies or troops by parachute. <i>They dropped bombs on Caen during the raid.</i>
falling	Decreasing in amount or degree. <i>Falling temperature.</i>
growl	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>The growl of diesel engines.</i>
hammering	The action or sound of hammering something. <i>A 7 0 hammering by the league leaders.</i>
hiss	Express disapproval of someone by hissing. <i>The audience hissed loudly at the mention of his name.</i>
howl	Make a howling sound. <i>He gave a howl of pain.</i>
loud	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music loud with force. <i>She spoke loudly and angrily.</i>
loudness	Tasteless showiness.
patter	Make light, rapid and repeated sounds. <i>Gently pattering rain.</i>
quash	Put an end to; suppress. <i>The government quashes any attempt of an uprising.</i>
quell	Subdue or silence (someone). <i>Quell my hunger.</i>
quench	An act of quenching a very hot substance. <i>Fury rose in him but he quenched it.</i>
screech	Make a high pitched screeching noise. <i>She hit her brother causing him to screech with pain.</i>
shriek	A high-pitched noise resembling a human cry. <i>She was shrieking abuse at a taxi.</i>

soothe	Give moral or emotional strength to. <i>To soothe the skin try chamomile or thyme.</i>
sound	Sound produced by continuous and regular vibrations as opposed to noise. Sound a certain note.
spatter	The noise of something spattering or sputtering explosively. <i>There was a spatter of freckles over her nose.</i>
splash	Mark or overlay with patches of contrasting color or texture cause to appear splashed or spattered. <i>He made a great splash and then disappeared.</i>
sprinkle	Place or attach (a number of things) at irregularly spaced intervals. <i>I sprinkled the floor with water.</i>
squash	Edible fruit of a squash plant eaten as a vegetable. <i>Wash and squash the cans before depositing them.</i>
squeal	Make a squeal. <i>They drew up with a squeal of brakes.</i>
squeeze	A twisting squeeze. <i>She was his main squeeze.</i>
thud	Make a noise typical of an engine lacking lubricants. <i>Bullets were thudding against the wall.</i>
thump	A heavy deadened sound. <i>Bristol thumped Rugby 35 13.</i>
thunder	Thunder sounds. <i>I am Brother Joachim he announced in a voice like thunder.</i>
whinny	Of a horse make a whinny. <i>The pony whinnied and tossed his head happily.</i>
