## Squelch as a Verb

### Definitions of "Squelch" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "squelch" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *To compress with violence, out of natural shape or condition.*
- *Forcefully silence or suppress.*
- *Walk through mud or mire.*
- *Make a soft sucking sound such as that made by treading heavily through mud.*
- *Make a sucking sound.*
- *Suppress or crush completely.*

**end** Be the end of be the last or concluding part of.

**extinguish** Extinguish by crushing.

**mash** Crush or smash something to a pulp.

*The barley is dried out over peat fires and **mashed** with water which flows through peat ground.*

**nip in the bud** Sever or remove by pinching or snipping.

**put a stop to** Adapt.

**put an end to** Estimate.

<b>put down</b>	Formulate in a particular style or language.
<b>quash</b>	Declare invalid. <i>The government <b>quashes</b> any attempt of an uprising.</i>
<b>quell</b>	Subdue or silence (someone). <i>Extra police were called to <b>quell</b> the disturbance.</i>
<b>quench</b>	Reduce the degree of (luminescence or phosphorescence) in (excited molecules or a material) by adding a suitable substance. <b>Quench</b> a rebellion.
<b>slop</b>	Feed slops to an animal. <i>The indignity of <b>slopping</b> out.</i>
<b>slosh</b>	Make a splashing sound. <i>Why did you <b>slosh</b> me.</i>
<b>splash</b>	Mark or overlay with patches of contrasting color or texture cause to appear splashed or spattered. <i>The story was <b>splashed</b> across the front pages.</i>
<b>splosh</b>	Make a splashing sound. <i>We had to <b>splosh</b> across the wet meadow.</i>
<b>squash</b>	Make one's way into a small or restricted space. <i>She needled him with such venom that Seb was visibly <b>squashed</b>.</i>
<b>squeeze</b>	Squeeze tightly between the fingers. <i>He found a hole in the hedge and <b>squeezed</b> his way through.</i>
<b>squish</b>	Put (a liquid) into a container or another place by means of a squirting action. <i>Strawberries so ripe that they <b>squished</b> if picked too firmly.</i>
<b>stamp out</b>	Affix a stamp to.
<b>stop</b>	Stop moving or operating. <i>A campaign is under way to <b>stop</b> the bombers.</i>
<b>subdue</b>	Overcome, quieten, or bring under control (a feeling or person). <b>Subdue</b> one's appetites.
<b>suppress</b>	Prevent or inhibit (a process or reaction). <i>Use of the drug <b>suppressed</b> the immune response.</i>

- *Squelch any sign of dissent.*
- *Property developers tried to squelch public protest.*

<b>appease</b>	Pacify or placate (someone) by acceding to their demands. <i>Amendments have been added to <b>appease</b> local pressure groups.</i>
<b>clang</b>	Make or cause to make a clang. <i>The bell of a fire engine <b>clanged</b>.</i>
<b>compress</b>	Express in a shorter form; abridge. <i><b>Compress</b> the data.</i>
<b>crush</b>	The act of crushing. <i>The plastic bottle <b>crushed</b> against the wall.</i>
<b>drop</b>	An act of dropping supplies or troops by parachute. <i>They <b>dropped</b> bombs on Caen during the raid.</i>
<b>falling</b>	Decreasing in amount or degree. <i><b>Falling</b> temperature.</i>
<b>growl</b>	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>The <b>growl</b> of diesel engines.</i>
<b>hammering</b>	The action or sound of hammering something. <i>A 7 0 <b>hammering</b> by the league leaders.</i>
<b>hiss</b>	Express disapproval of someone by hissing. <i>The audience <b>hissed</b> loudly at the mention of his name.</i>
<b>howl</b>	Make a howling sound. <i>He gave a <b>howl</b> of pain.</i>
<b>loud</b>	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music loud with force. <i>She spoke <b>loudly</b> and angrily.</i>
<b>loudness</b>	Tasteless showiness.
<b>patter</b>	Make light, rapid and repeated sounds. <i>Gently <b>pattering</b> rain.</i>
<b>quash</b>	Put an end to; suppress. <i>The government <b>quashes</b> any attempt of an uprising.</i>
<b>quell</b>	Subdue or silence (someone). <i><b>Quell</b> my hunger.</i>
<b>quench</b>	An act of quenching a very hot substance. <i>Fury rose in him but he <b>quenched</b> it.</i>
<b>screech</b>	Make a high pitched screeching noise. <i>She hit her brother causing him to <b>screech</b> with pain.</i>
<b>shriek</b>	A high-pitched noise resembling a human cry. <i>She was <b>shrieking</b> abuse at a taxi.</i>

<b>soothe</b>	Give moral or emotional strength to. <i>To <b>soothe</b> the skin try chamomile or thyme.</i>
<b>sound</b>	Sound produced by continuous and regular vibrations as opposed to noise. <b>Sound</b> a certain note.
<b>spatter</b>	The noise of something spattering or sputtering explosively. <i>There was a <b>spatter</b> of freckles over her nose.</i>
<b>splash</b>	Mark or overlay with patches of contrasting color or texture cause to appear splashed or spattered. <i>He made a great <b>splash</b> and then disappeared.</i>
<b>sprinkle</b>	Place or attach (a number of things) at irregularly spaced intervals. <i>I <b>sprinkled</b> the floor with water.</i>
<b>squash</b>	Edible fruit of a squash plant eaten as a vegetable. <i>Wash and <b>squash</b> the cans before depositing them.</i>
<b>squeal</b>	Make a squeal. <i>They drew up with a <b>squeal</b> of brakes.</i>
<b>squeeze</b>	A twisting squeeze. <i>She was his main <b>squeeze</b>.</i>
<b>thud</b>	Make a noise typical of an engine lacking lubricants. <i>Bullets were <b>thudding</b> against the wall.</i>
<b>thump</b>	A heavy deadened sound. <i>Bristol <b>thumped</b> Rugby 35 13.</i>
<b>thunder</b>	Thunder sounds. <i>I am Brother Joachim he announced in a voice like <b>thunder</b>.</i>
<b>whinny</b>	Of a horse make a whinny. <i>The pony whinnied and tossed his head happily.</i>
