
## **Stability as a Noun**

lucidity	The ability to think clearly, especially in intervals between periods of confusion or insanity. <i>She had moments of lucidity.</i>
lucidness	Your overall circumstances or condition in life (including everything that happens to you.
permanence	The state or quality of lasting or remaining unchanged indefinitely. <i>The clarity and <b>permanence</b> of the dyes.</i>
rationality	The quality of being able to think sensibly or logically. Scott wanted to play the character with a bit more dignity and <b>rationality</b> .
reason	A rational motive for a belief or action. The <b>reason</b> a steady state was never reached was that the back pressure built up too slowly.
reliability	The quality of being dependable or reliable. <i>The car s background gives me every confidence in its <b>reliability</b>.</i>
safety	A device designed to prevent injury or accidents. <i>The survivors were airlifted to <b>safety</b>.</i>
saneness	Normal or sound powers of mind.
<u>sanity</u>	Reasonable and rational behaviour. I began to doubt my own <b>sanity</b> .
secureness	The state of freedom from fear or danger.
<u>security</u>	Procedures followed or measures taken to ensure the security of a state or organization. <i>The system is designed to provide maximum security against toxic</i> <i>spills.</i>
sense	Relating to or denoting a coding sequence of nucleotides complementary to an antisense sequence. In the best <b>sense</b> charity is really a duty.
solidity	The quality of being solid and reliable financially or factually or morally. The <b>solidity</b> of the evidence worked in his favor.
soundness	The muscle tone of healthy tissue. Mental and physical <b>soundness</b> .
stableness	The quality or attribute of being firm and steadfast.
steadiness	The quality not shaking or moving. The relative <b>steadiness</b> of prices during 2013 was an indication that the market was adequately supplied.



stoutness	The quality of being strong and thick. <i>He was concerned about France s <b>stoutness</b> in the centre of the field.</i>
strength	The emotional or mental qualities necessary in dealing with difficult or distressing situations. The <b>strength</b> of the drinks.
sturdiness	The property of something that is strongly built. <i>Sturdiness of moral principle.</i>
<u>sureness</u>	Freedom from doubt; belief in yourself and your abilities. <i>Sureness</i> of hand.
