- *(of a place or surface) filled or covered with goods.*
- *Having a large bosom and pleasing curves.*
- *(of a number of things) put or arranged in a stack or stacks.*
- *(of a woman) having large breasts.*
- *(of a woman's body) having a large bosom and pleasing curves.*
- *(of a heel) made from thin layers of material glued one on top of the other.*
- *(of a stream of data) stored in such a way that the most recently stored item is the first to be retrieved.*
- *Arranged in a stack.*
- *(of a task) placed in a queue for subsequent processing.*

*A **stuffed** parrot.*
- voluptuous** Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses.  
*Long curtains in **voluptuous** crimson velvet.*
- well-endowed** Having a large bosom and pleasing curves.

<b>heap</b>	Put objects or a loose substance in a heap. <i><b>Heaped</b> up in one corner was a pile of junk.</i>
<b>lot</b>	Divide into lots as of land for example. <i>A <b>lot</b> of money.</i>
<b>luxurious</b>	Extremely comfortable or elegant, especially when involving great expense. <i>Enjoyed a <b>luxurious</b> suite with a crystal chandelier and thick oriental rugs.</i>
<b>many</b>	The majority of people. <i>The temptations are <b>many</b>.</i>
<b>most</b>	Almost. <i>Who has the <b>most</b> apples.</i>
<b>much</b>	Very. <i>Thanks very <b>much</b>.</i>
<b>multiplicity</b>	The property of being multiple. <i>The demand for higher education depends on a <b>multiplicity</b> of factors.</i>
<b>pile</b>	Place or lay as if in a pile. <i>She <b>piled</b> all the groceries on the counter.</i>

<b>plenitude</b>	An abundance. <i>The <b>plenitude</b> of the Pope s powers.</i>
<b>plenteous</b>	Affording an abundant supply. <i>The meal was astonishingly <b>plenteous</b>.</i>
<b>plentiful</b>	Producing in abundance. <i>A <b>plentiful</b> year.</i>
<b>plentitude</b>	A full supply.
<b><u>plenty</u></b>	A large number or amount or extent. <i>There was <b>plenty</b> of food for everyone.</i>
<b>profusion</b>	The property of being extremely abundant. <i>The <b>profusion</b> of detail.</i>
<b>sheaf</b>	A bundle of grain stalks laid lengthways and tied together after reaping. <i>The corn and barley had to be <b>sheafed</b> and stooked.</i>
<b><u>stack</u></b>	Load or cover with stacks. <i>He spent most of the time <b>stacking</b> shelves.</i>
<b>sybarite</b>	A person addicted to luxury and pleasures of the senses.
<b>ton</b>	A unit of weight or volume of sea cargo equal to a metric ton 1 000 kg or 40 cu ft. <i>All of a sudden I had <b>tons</b> of friends.</i>
