Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing. Such an enormous response was **astonishing**. <u>astonishing</u>


Bewildering or striking dumb with wonder. <u>astounding</u>

### Associations of "Staggering" (30 Words)

Surprise (someone) greatly; fill with astonishment.

He has been **amaze**d by the quality of the employees at the bank.

**amazing** Inspiring awe or admiration or wonder.

It is **amazing** how short memories are.

**astonish** Surprise or impress (someone) greatly.

You never fail to astonish me.

**astonishing** Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing. *Such an enormous response was astonishing.* 

**astound** Shock or greatly surprise. Her bluntness **astound**ed him.

So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm.

**Extremely impressive or daunting; inspiring awe.** 

The **awesome** complexity of the universe.

A state of stunned confusion or bewilderment.

His mother s death left him in a daze.

**exceeding** Extremely exceedingly.

She spoke warmly of his **exceeding** kindness.

Greatly surprised or astonished.

This news has left me totally **flabbergasted**.

Produce or try to produce a vivid impression of.

This child **impress**ed me as unusually mature.

incredible Very good; wonderful.

marvelous

puzzled

The noise from the crowd was **incredible**.

Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers.

A marvelous collection of rare books.

prodigious

So great in size or force or extent as to elicit awe.

The stove consumed a **prodigious** amount of fuel.

Unable to understand; perplexed.

She looked **puzzled** and angry with him.

redoubtable (of a person) formidable, especially as an opponent.

He was a **redoubtable** debater.

The occurrence and development of events by chance in a happy or

**serendipity** beneficial way.

A fortunate stroke of **serendipity**.



**shattering** Seemingly loud enough to break something; violently rattling or clattering.

The **shattering** peal of artillery.

shock Collect or gather into shocks.

The scandalous behavior of this married woman **shock**ed her friends.

**shocking** Causing a feeling of surprise and dismay. *The most shocking book of its time.* 

Move or jump suddenly, as if in surprise or alarm.

**Startle** The loud noise **startle**d him awake.

**startling** Very surprising, astonishing, or remarkable.

She had **startling** blue eyes.

**stupefy**Make (someone) unable to think or feel properly.

The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to **stupefy** her.

surprise Cause to be surprised.

The news really **surprise**d me.

**surprised**Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment.

**Surprised** that he remembered my name.

**Surprising** Causing surprise or wonder or amazement.

A **surprising** sequence of events.

In an amazing manner; to everyone's surprise.

surprisingly

The finale ends surprisingly.

**unexpectedly** In a way that was not expected or regarded as likely.

**pecteury** He died **unexpectedly** of a heart attack.

wonderful Inspiring delight, pleasure, or admiration; extremely good; marvellous.

They all think she s wonderful.

wondering Showing curiosity.

Peter listened with an air of **wondering** astonishment.
