- *So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm.*



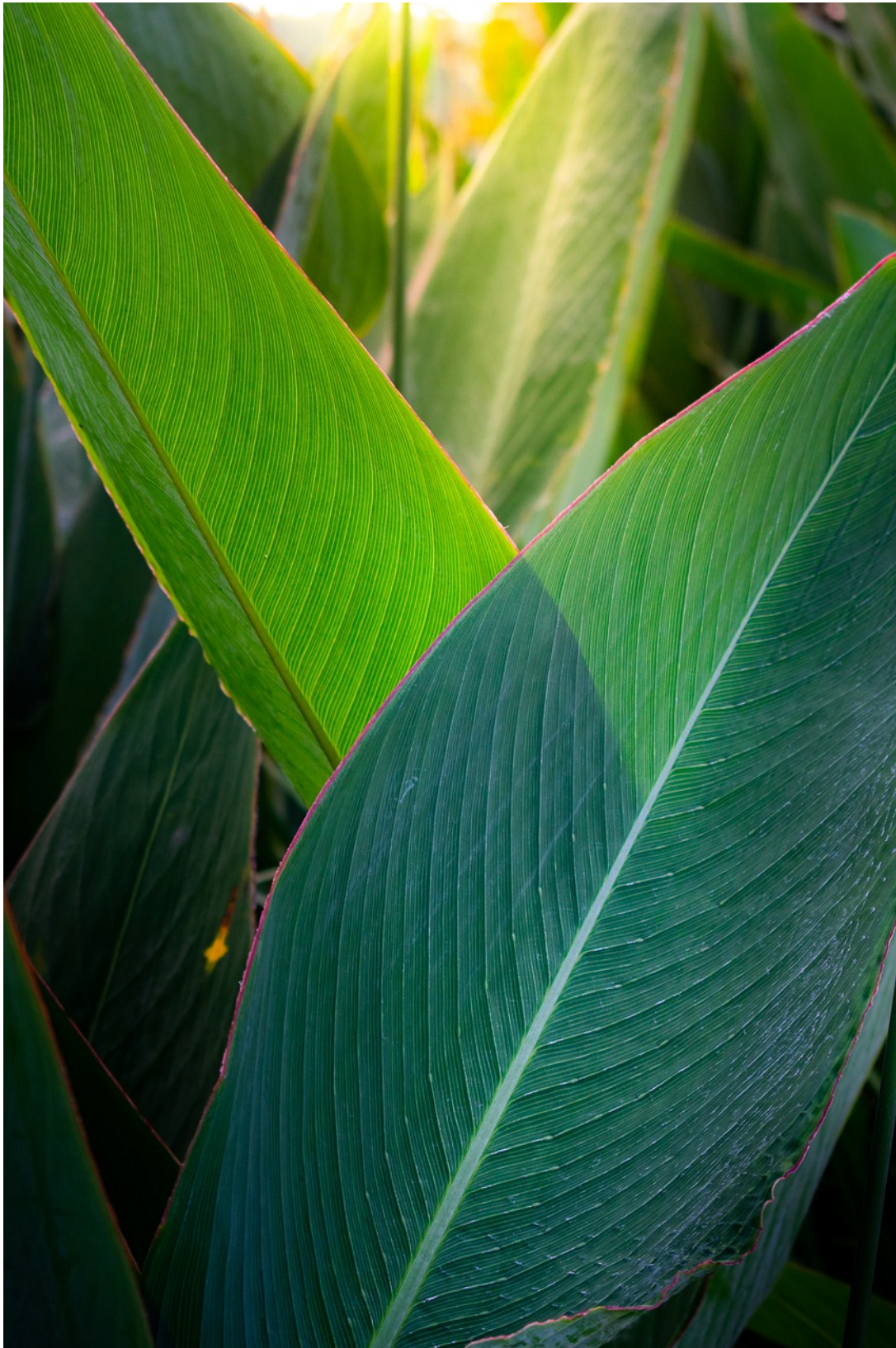
## Synonyms of "Staggering" as an adjective (3 Words)

- astounding** Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing.  
*Such an enormous response was **astounding**.*
- astounding** Bewildering or striking dumb with wonder.  
*The summit offers **astounding** views.*
- stupefying** Making physically stupid or dull or insensible.  
*A **stupefying** blow to the head.*



## Usage Examples of "Staggering" as an adjective

- *Suffered a staggering defeat.*
- *The staggering bills for maintenance and repair.*
- *The amount of money required was staggering.*



## Associations of "Staggering" (30 Words)

<b>amaze</b>	Surprise (someone) greatly; fill with astonishment. <i>He has been <b>amazed</b> by the quality of the employees at the bank.</i>
<b>amazing</b>	Inspiring awe or admiration or wonder. <i>It is <b>amazing</b> how short memories are.</i>
<b>astonish</b>	Surprise or impress (someone) greatly. <i>You never fail to <b>astonish</b> me.</i>
<b>astonishing</b>	Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing. <i>Such an enormous response was <b>astonishing</b>.</i>
<b>astound</b>	Shock or greatly surprise. <i>Her bluntness <b>astounded</b> him.</i>
<b>astounding</b>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The summit offers <b>astounding</b> views.</i>
<b>awesome</b>	Extremely impressive or daunting; inspiring awe. <i>The <b>awesome</b> complexity of the universe.</i>
<b>daze</b>	A state of stunned confusion or bewilderment. <i>His mother's death left him in a <b>daze</b>.</i>
<b>exceeding</b>	Extremely exceedingly. <i>She spoke warmly of his <b>exceeding</b> kindness.</i>
<b>flabbergasted</b>	Greatly surprised or astonished. <i>This news has left me totally <b>flabbergasted</b>.</i>
<b>impress</b>	Produce or try to produce a vivid impression of. <i>This child <b>impressed</b> me as unusually mature.</i>
<b>incredible</b>	Very good; wonderful. <i>The noise from the crowd was <b>incredible</b>.</i>
<b>marvelous</b>	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>A <b>marvelous</b> collection of rare books.</i>
<b>prodigious</b>	So great in size or force or extent as to elicit awe. <i>The stove consumed a <b>prodigious</b> amount of fuel.</i>
<b>puzzled</b>	Unable to understand; perplexed. <i>She looked <b>puzzled</b> and angry with him.</i>
<b>redoubtable</b>	(of a person) formidable, especially as an opponent. <i>He was a <b>redoubtable</b> debater.</i>
<b>serendipity</b>	The occurrence and development of events by chance in a happy or beneficial way. <i>A fortunate stroke of <b>serendipity</b>.</i>

<b>shattering</b>	Seemingly loud enough to break something; violently rattling or clattering. <i>The <b>shattering</b> peal of artillery.</i>
<b>shock</b>	Collect or gather into shocks. <i>The scandalous behavior of this married woman <b>shocked</b> her friends.</i>
<b>shocking</b>	Causing a feeling of surprise and dismay. <i>The most <b>shocking</b> book of its time.</i>
<b>startle</b>	Move or jump suddenly, as if in surprise or alarm. <i>The loud noise <b>startled</b> him awake.</i>
<b>startling</b>	Very surprising, astonishing, or remarkable. <i>She had <b>startling</b> blue eyes.</i>
<b>stupefy</b>	Make (someone) unable to think or feel properly. <i>The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to <b>stupefy</b> her.</i>
<b>surprise</b>	Cause to be surprised. <i>The news really <b>surprised</b> me.</i>
<b>surprised</b>	Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment. <i><b>Surprised</b> that he remembered my name.</i>
<b>surprising</b>	Causing surprise or wonder or amazement. <i>A <b>surprising</b> sequence of events.</i>
<b>surprisingly</b>	In an amazing manner; to everyone's surprise. <i>The finale ends <b>surprisingly</b>.</i>
<b>unexpectedly</b>	In a way that was not expected or regarded as likely. <i>He died <b>unexpectedly</b> of a heart attack.</i>
<b>wonderful</b>	Inspiring delight, pleasure, or admiration; extremely good; marvellous. <i>They all think she s <b>wonderful</b>.</i>
<b>wondering</b>	Showing curiosity. <i>Peter listened with an air of <b>wondering</b> astonishment.</i>
