- *So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm.*



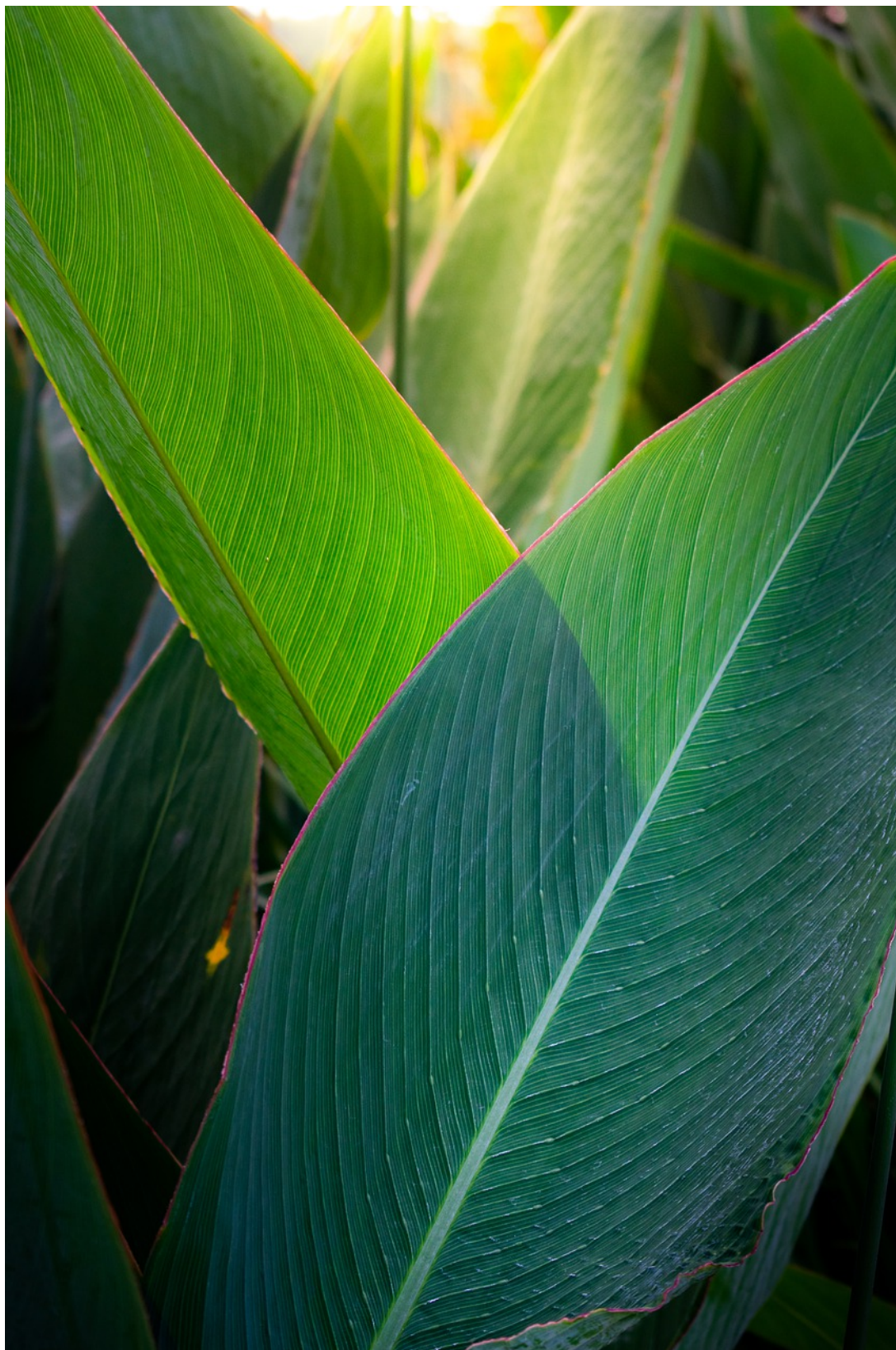
Synonyms of "Staggering" as an adjective (3 Words)

- astonishing** Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing.
*Such an enormous response was **astonishing**.*
- astounding** Bewildering or striking dumb with wonder.
*The summit offers **astounding** views.*
- stupefying** Making physically stupid or dull or insensible.
*A **stupefying** blow to the head.*



Usage Examples of "Staggering" as an adjective

- *Suffered a staggering defeat.*
- *The staggering bills for maintenance and repair.*
- *The amount of money required was staggering.*



Associations of "Staggering" (30 Words)

<u>amaze</u>	Surprise (someone) greatly; fill with astonishment. <i>He has been amazed by the quality of the employees at the bank.</i>
amazing	Inspiring awe or admiration or wonder. <i>It is amazing how short memories are.</i>
astonish	Surprise or impress (someone) greatly. <i>You never fail to astonish me.</i>
<u>astonishing</u>	Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing. <i>Such an enormous response was astonishing.</i>
astound	Shock or greatly surprise. <i>Her bluntness astounded him.</i>
<u>astounding</u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The summit offers astounding views.</i>
awesome	Extremely impressive or daunting; inspiring awe. <i>The awesome complexity of the universe.</i>
<u>daze</u>	A state of stunned confusion or bewilderment. <i>His mother's death left him in a daze.</i>
exceeding	Extremely exceedingly. <i>She spoke warmly of his exceeding kindness.</i>
<u>flabbergasted</u>	Greatly surprised or astonished. <i>This news has left me totally flabbergasted.</i>
<u>impress</u>	Produce or try to produce a vivid impression of. <i>This child impressed me as unusually mature.</i>
incredible	Very good; wonderful. <i>The noise from the crowd was incredible.</i>
<u>marvelous</u>	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>A marvelous collection of rare books.</i>
prodigious	So great in size or force or extent as to elicit awe. <i>The stove consumed a prodigious amount of fuel.</i>
<u>puzzled</u>	Unable to understand; perplexed. <i>She looked puzzled and angry with him.</i>
redoubtable	(of a person) formidable, especially as an opponent. <i>He was a redoubtable debater.</i>
serendipity	The occurrence and development of events by chance in a happy or beneficial way. <i>A fortunate stroke of serendipity.</i>

shattering	Seemingly loud enough to break something; violently rattling or clattering. <i>The shattering peal of artillery.</i>
shock	Collect or gather into shocks. <i>The scandalous behavior of this married woman shocked her friends.</i>
<u>shocking</u>	Causing a feeling of surprise and dismay. <i>The most shocking book of its time.</i>
<u>startle</u>	Move or jump suddenly, as if in surprise or alarm. <i>The loud noise startled him awake.</i>
<u>startling</u>	Very surprising, astonishing, or remarkable. <i>She had startling blue eyes.</i>
stupefy	Make (someone) unable to think or feel properly. <i>The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to stupefy her.</i>
surprise	Cause to be surprised. <i>The news really surprised me.</i>
surprised	Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment. <i>Surprised that he remembered my name.</i>
<u>surprising</u>	Causing surprise or wonder or amazement. <i>A surprising sequence of events.</i>
<u>surprisingly</u>	In an amazing manner; to everyone's surprise. <i>The finale ends surprisingly.</i>
unexpectedly	In a way that was not expected or regarded as likely. <i>He died unexpectedly of a heart attack.</i>
wonderful	Inspiring delight, pleasure, or admiration; extremely good; marvellous. <i>They all think she s wonderful.</i>
<u>wondering</u>	Showing curiosity. <i>Peter listened with an air of wondering astonishment.</i>
