
### **Stagnant as an Adjective**

#### **Definitions of "Stagnant" as an adjective**

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "stagnant" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Showing no activity; dull and sluggish.
- Not circulating or flowing.
- Not growing or changing; without force or vitality.
- (of a body of water or the atmosphere of a confined space) having no current or flow and often having an unpleasant smell as a consequence.





## Synonyms of "Stagnant" as an adjective (24 Words)

<u>dead</u>	No longer current, relevant, or important. The ball had gone <b>dead</b> .
declining	Diminishing in strength or quality; deteriorating. <b>Declining</b> budgets.
depressed	(of a place or economic activity) suffering the damaging effects of a lack of demand or employment. She felt lonely and <b>depressed</b> .
<u>dormant</u>	(of an animal) depicted lying with its head on its paws. <b>Dormant</b> butterflies.
dull	Not active or brisk. <b>Dull</b> greens and blues.
<u>dying</u>	(of a period of time) final; closing. <b>Dying</b> to hear who won.



<u>flat</u>	Flattened laterally along the whole length e g certain leafstalks or flatfishes. <i>A</i> <b>flat</b> <i>rectangular box.</i>
immobile	Not moving; motionless. An <b>immobile</b> workforce.
inactive	(pathology) not progressing or increasing; or progressing slowly. An <b>inactive</b> lifestyle.
<u>inert</u>	Having only a limited ability to react chemically; chemically inactive. <i>She was fat and inert</i> .
<u>lethargic</u>	Deficient in alertness or activity. Bullfrogs became <b>lethargic</b> with the first cold nights.
<u>lifeless</u>	Deprived of life; no longer living. A <b>lifeless</b> body.
moribund	(of a person) at the point of death. On examination she was <b>moribund</b> and dehydrated.
<u>motionless</u>	Not in physical motion. An eagle hung almost <b>motionless</b> close to the ground.
quiet	Of the sun characterized by a low level of surface phenomena like sunspots e.g. <i>The quiet waters of a lagoon.</i>
slack	Having or showing laziness or negligence. <i>Slack</i> in maintaining discipline.
slow	Slow to learn or understand lacking intellectual acuity Thackeray. <i>The slow lane of traffic.</i>
slow-moving	Moving slowly.
sluggish	Moving slowly. Alex woke late feeling tired and <b>sluggish</b> .
stagnating	(of water or air) ceasing to flow or move; becoming stagnant. <i>Stagnating</i> consumer confidence.
standing	Executed in or initiated from a standing position. I took a <b>standing</b> jump.
<u>static</u>	Relating to statics. An electro <b>static</b> generator produces high voltage <b>static</b> electricity.
<u>stationary</u>	(of a planet) having no apparent motion in longitude. A <b>stationary</b> population.
still	Not sparkling. Her voice carried on the <b>still</b> air.

# Associations of "Stagnant" (30 Words)

abeyant	Inactive but capable of becoming active.
aboveground	On or above the surface of the ground. <i>Aboveground nuclear testing</i> .
bathing	Immersing the body in water or sunshine.
<u>brook</u>	Put up with something or somebody unpleasant. The Lake District boasts lovely lakes and babbling <b>brook</b> s.
frog	Hunt frogs for food.
grotto	An indoor structure resembling a cave. Visits to Father Christmas s <b>grotto</b> .
gully	A fielder at gully. <i>He was caught in the <b>gully</b> by Jones.</i>
idleness	The quality of lacking substance or value. <i>He was punished for his <b>idleness</b> at school.</i>
inactive	Lacking in energy or will. <i>Inactive</i> reserve.
inactivity	A disposition to remain inactive or inert. Don t suddenly take up violent exercise after years of <b>inactivity</b> .
<u>inert</u>	Lacking the ability or strength to move. <i>She lay <b>inert</b> in her bed.</i>
lagoon	An artificial pool for the treatment of effluent or to accommodate an overspill from surface drains during heavy rain.
latent	Potentially existing but not presently evident or realized. Diabetes may be <b>latent</b> for some years before diagnosis.
laze	Spend time in a relaxed, lazy manner. A <b>laze</b> in the sun.
<u>motionless</u>	Not moving; stationary. An eagle hung almost <b>motionless</b> close to the ground.
pond	Of flowing water or other liquids form a pond. Water should never be allowed to <b>pond</b> on your property.



<u>pool</u>	Something resembling a pool of liquid. I spent all my time lounging around the <b>pool</b> .
<u>puddle</u>	Wade or dabble in a puddle. The cobbles under our feet were wet and <b>puddle</b> d.
quiescence	A state of quiet (but possibly temporary) inaction. This method has been shown to induce sleep like <b>quiescence</b> in adult animals.
<u>sedentary</u>	Requiring sitting or little activity. A <b>sedentary</b> lifestyle spells bad news for hips and thighs.
springboard	A strong, flexible board from which someone may jump in order to gain added impetus when performing a dive or a gymnastic movement. <i>He uses other people s ideas as a <b>springboard</b> for his own.</i>
<u>stationary</u>	Not changing in quantity or condition. A car collided with a <b>stationary</b> vehicle.
swampy	(of soil) soft and watery. A <b>swampy</b> area.
<u>swim</u>	An act or period of swimming. We went for a <b>swim</b> in the river.
swimmer	A person who travels through the water by swimming. <i>Red flags to warn <b>swimmer</b>s of dangerous currents.</i>
<u>swimming</u>	The act of swimming. <b>Swimming</b> eyes.
swimsuit	Tight fitting garment worn for swimming.
tadpole	A larval frog or toad.
tarn	A small mountain lake. <i>Malham <b>Tarn</b></i> .
torpid	Mentally or physically inactive; lethargic. A mind grown <b>torpid</b> in old age.
