- A site on a street for a market, street vendor's stall, or taxi rank.
- A ledge or foothold on which a belay can be secured.
- The attitude of a person or organization towards something; a standpoint.
- A rationalized mental attitude.
- Standing posture.

His **thinking** is reflected in his later autobiography.












Usage Examples of "Stance" as a noun
