Stance as a Noun

Definitions of "Stance" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “stance” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The way in which someone stands, especially when deliberately adopted (as in cricket, golf, and other sports); a person's posture.*
- *A site on a street for a market, street vendor's stall, or taxi rank.*
- *A ledge or foothold on which a belay can be secured.*
- *The attitude of a person or organization towards something; a standpoint.*
- *A rationalized mental attitude.*
- *Standing posture.*



Synonyms of "Stance" as a noun (28 Words)

angle

Angle iron or a similar constructional material made of another metal.
*The supporting frame is usually of aluminium **angle** bolted together.*

approach

An initial proposal or request made to someone.
*His **approach** to every problem is to draw up a list of pros and cons.*

attitude

The orientation of an aircraft or spacecraft, relative to the direction of travel.
*She snapped her fingers with **attitude**.*

bearing

Characteristic way of bearing one's body.
*There were no steeples or bridges from which to take a **bearing**.*

body position

The central message of a communication.

feelings

The sensation produced by pressure receptors in the skin.
*The remark hurt his **feelings**.*

ideas

Melodic subject of a musical composition.
He has an idea that we don't like him.

line	A line marking the starting or finishing point in a race. <i>A row of closely spaced dots will look like a continuous line.</i>
opinion	A formal statement of reasons for a judgement given. <i>His opinions appeared frequently on the editorial page.</i>
<u>outlook</u>	Belief about (or mental picture of) the future. <i>The pleasant outlook from the club window.</i>
perspective	The appearance of viewed objects with regard to their relative position, distance from the viewer, etc. <i>A trick of perspective.</i>
place	A person's home. <i>That street was no place for a lady.</i>
point of view	The dot at the left of a decimal fraction.
policy	A line of argument rationalizing the course of action of a government. <i>It was a policy of retribution.</i>
pose	A posture assumed by models for photographic or artistic purposes. <i>The man dropped his pose of amiability.</i>
position	An opinion that is held in opposition to another in an argument or dispute. <i>Sew the band into position.</i>
<u>posture</u>	A way of behaving that is intended to convey a false impression; a pose. <i>The snake inverts itself into the mock dead posture.</i>
sentiments	Tender, romantic, or nostalgic feeling or emotion.
<u>site</u>	A website. <i>The concrete is mixed on site.</i>
<u>slant</u>	A biased way of looking at or presenting something. <i>A new slant on science.</i>
<u>spot</u>	A particular place or point. <i>A spot of tea.</i>
stand	The position where a thing or person stands. <i>His traditionalist stand.</i>
<u>standpoint</u>	The position from which someone is able to view a scene or an object. <i>She writes on religion from the standpoint of a believer.</i>
<u>station</u>	The frequency assigned to a broadcasting station. <i>A research station in the rainforest.</i>
thinking	The process of considering or reasoning about something. <i>His thinking is reflected in his later autobiography.</i>

- thoughts** The process of using your mind to consider something carefully.
*What are your **thoughts** on Haiti.*
- viewpoint** A person's opinion or point of view.
*I do try to put over our **viewpoint**.*
- way of thinking** How a result is obtained or an end is achieved.



Usage Examples of "Stance" as a noun

- *She altered her stance, resting all her weight on one leg.*
- *The party is changing its stance on Europe.*



Associations of "Stance" (30 Words)

ban	Ban from a place of residence as for punishment. <i>A three year driving ban.</i>
block	Shape by using a block. <i>The thick curtain blocked the action on the stage.</i>
commons	Provisions shared in common; rations. <i>The state was divided into clergy nobility and commons.</i>
courtyard	An unroofed area that is completely or partially enclosed by walls or buildings, typically one forming part of a castle or large house.
disinformation	Misinformation that is deliberately disseminated in order to influence or confuse rivals (foreign enemies or business competitors etc). <i>A government inspired disinformation campaign.</i>

facet	Any of the individual units (ommatidia) that make up the compound eye of an insect or crustacean. <i>A blue and green jewel that shines from a million facets.</i>
faction	A dissenting clique. <i>A council increasingly split by faction.</i>
forbidden	Not allowed; banned. <i>Forbidden fruit.</i>
hegemony	The dominance or leadership of one social group or nation over others. <i>The consolidation of the United States hegemony over a new international economic system.</i>
knave	A deceitful and unreliable scoundrel.
left	On or to the left side. <i>I rarely lose a left hand glove.</i>
lieu	The post or function properly or customarily occupied or served by another. <i>In lieu of.</i>
locale	A place where something happens or is set, or that has particular events associated with it. <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic locales.</i>
location	A point or extent in space. <i>The movie was filmed entirely on location.</i>
locus	A curve or other figure formed by all the points satisfying a particular equation of the relation between coordinates, or by a point, line, or surface moving according to mathematically defined conditions. <i>The real locus of power is the informal council.</i>
mendacious	Intentionally untrue. <i>Mendacious propaganda.</i>
mendacity	The tendency to be untruthful. <i>People publicly castigated for past mendacity.</i>
misinformation	Information that is incorrect. <i>Nuclear matters are often entangled in a web of secrecy and misinformation.</i>
nonviolent	Achieved without bloodshed.
pacifist	Opposed to war. <i>She was a committed pacifist all her life.</i>
park	Maneuver a vehicle into a parking space. <i>A coach park.</i>

place	Score a goal by a place kick. <i>A newspaper had been placed beside my plate.</i>
plaza	A public square, marketplace, or similar open space in a built-up area. <i>The plaza is lively in the evenings when the pavement cafes are full.</i>
position	An opinion that is held in opposition to another in an argument or dispute. <i>Atheists do not enjoy a favorable position in American life.</i>
<u>posture</u>	Assume a posture as for artistic purposes. <i>He took ballet lessons to improve his posture.</i>
prohibitionist	A reformer who opposes the use of intoxicating beverages.
<u>propaganda</u>	The dissemination of propaganda as a political strategy. <i>The party s leaders believed that a long period of education and propaganda would be necessary.</i>
<u>site</u>	A website. <i>Some servers use cookies to track users from site to site.</i>
<u>situated</u>	Situated in a particular spot or position. <i>Nicely situated on a quiet riverbank.</i>
spreading	Process or result of distributing or extending over a wide expanse of space.
