chill	Chilly. <i>Chill the soup slightly before serving.</i>
chilly	Lacking warmth of feeling. <i>A female form in marble a chilly but ideal medium for depicting abstract virtues.</i>
cold	Extended meanings especially of psychological coldness without human warmth or emotion. <i>A cold trail.</i>
coldness	A lack of affection or enthusiasm. <i>A distressing coldness of tone and manner.</i>
coolness	Freedom from excitement, anxiety, or excessive emotion. <i>The refreshing coolness of the water.</i>
freezing	The freezing point of water 0 C. <i>Strong winds and freezing temperatures.</i>
frigid	Sexually unresponsive. <i>A frigid day.</i>
frigidity	A lack of affection or enthusiasm.
frosty	Cold and unfriendly in manner. <i>Got a frosty reception.</i>
frozen	Not convertible to cash. <i>A frozen look on their faces.</i>
gelid	Extremely cold. <i>The gelid pond.</i>
glacial	A glacial period. <i>An official described progress in the talks as glacial.</i>
ice	A sheet or layer of ice on the surface of water. <i>She scraped the ice off the windscreen.</i>
iceberg	A large mass of ice floating at sea; usually broken off of a polar glacier. <i>Iceberg is still the most popular lettuce.</i>

icy	Very cold. <i>Icy hands.</i>
insensible	Unaware of or indifferent to. <i>Insensible to the suffering around him.</i>
polar	Of an animal or plant living in the north or south polar region. <i>The polar events of this study.</i>
refrigeration	Deliberately lowering the body's temperature for therapeutic purposes. <i>Refrigeration by immersing the patient's body in a cold bath.</i>
rime	Frost formed on cold objects by the rapid freezing of water vapour in cloud or fog. <i>He does not brush away the frost that rimes his beard.</i>
sleet	A thin coating of ice formed by sleet or rain freezing on coming into contact with a cold surface. <i>Driving sleet and rain made conditions horrendous.</i>
snowfall	Precipitation falling from clouds in the form of ice crystals. <i>The average snowfall is 75 m a year.</i>
snowy	Of the white color of snow. <i>A long snowy winter.</i>
winter	The period from the winter solstice to the vernal equinox. <i>Birds wintering in the Channel Islands.</i>
wintry	Characteristic of winter, especially in feeling or looking very cold and bleak. <i>Wintry smile.</i>
