coldness	A lack of affection or enthusiasm. A distressing coldness of tone and manner.
coolness	Freedom from excitement, anxiety, or excessive emotion. <i>The refreshing coolness of the water.</i>
freezing	The freezing point of water 0 C. Strong winds and freezing temperatures.
<u>frigid</u>	Sexually unresponsive. A frigid day.
frigidity	A lack of affection or enthusiasm.
frosty	Cold and unfriendly in manner. Got a frosty reception.
<u>frozen</u>	Not convertible to cash. A frozen look on their faces.
gelid	Extremely cold. The gelid pond.
glacial	A glacial period. An official described progress in the talks as glacial .
ice	A sheet or layer of ice on the surface of water. She scraped the ice off the windscreen.
iceberg	A large mass of ice floating at sea; usually broken off of a polar glacier. <i>Iceberg</i> is still the most popular lettuce.



icy	Very cold. <i>Icy</i> hands.
insensible	Unaware of or indifferent to. <i>Insensible</i> to the suffering around him.
polar	Of an animal or plant living in the north or south polar region. The polar events of this study.
refrigeration	Deliberately lowering the body's temperature for therapeutic purposes. Refrigeration by immersing the patient s body in a cold bath.
rime	Frost formed on cold objects by the rapid freezing of water vapour in cloud or fog. <i>He does not brush away the frost that rimes his beard.</i>
sleet	A thin coating of ice formed by sleet or rain freezing on coming into contact with a cold surface. Driving sleet and rain made conditions horrendous.
snowfall	Precipitation falling from clouds in the form of ice crystals. <i>The average</i> snowfall is 7 5 m a year.
snowy	Of the white color of snow. A long snowy winter.
<u>winter</u>	The period from the winter solstice to the vernal equinox. Birds winter ing in the Channel Islands.
wintry	Characteristic of winter, especially in feeling or looking very cold and bleak. <i>Wintry</i> smile.
