## Staple as a Noun

### Definitions of "Staple" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “staple” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A necessary commodity for which demand is constant.*
- *A short U-shaped wire nail for securing cables.*
- *(usually in the plural) a necessary commodity for which demand is constant.*
- *Material suitable for manufacture or use or finishing.*
- *A natural fiber (raw cotton, wool, hemp, flax) that can be twisted to form yarn.*
- *Paper fastener consisting of a short length of U-shaped wire that can fasten papers together.*
- *A piece of thin wire with two short right-angled end pieces which are driven by a stapler through sheets of paper to fasten them together.*
- *A U-shaped metal bar with pointed ends for driving into wood to hold things such as wires in place.*



## Synonyms of "Staple" as a noun (4 Words)

### **basic**

Essential food and other supplies.  
*I learnt the **basics** of programming on a course.*

**raw material** Informal terms for nakedness.

**staple fiber** A natural fiber (raw cotton, wool, hemp, flax) that can be twisted to form yarn.

**staple fibre** Material suitable for manufacture or use or finishing.

Of primary importance.

Offering or constituting the minimum required without elaboration or luxury.

*A **basic** course in Russian.*

### central

In or near a center or constituting a center; the inner area.

*Coaches met at a **central** location.*

### elementary

Of or pertaining to or characteristic of elementary school or elementary education.

*An **elementary** astronomy course.*

### elements

Violent or severe weather viewed as caused by the action of the four elements.

*They felt the full fury of the **elements**.*

<b>essential</b>	Anything indispensable. <i>The <b>essential</b> weakness of the plaintiff's case.</i>
<b>essentially</b>	In essence; at bottom or by one's (or its) very nature. <i>The argument was <b>essentially</b> a technical one.</i>
<b>fundamental</b>	A fundamental note tone or frequency. <i>Committed the <b>fundamental</b> error of confusing spending with extravagance.</i>
<b>fundamentally</b>	Used to make an emphatic statement about the basic truth of something. <i>Two <b>fundamentally</b> different concepts of democracy.</i>
<b>importantly</b>	Used to emphasize a significant point. <i>A non drinking non smoking and <b>importantly</b> non political sportsman.</i>
<b>indispensability</b>	The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without.
<b>indispensable</b>	Unavoidable. <i>He made himself <b>indispensable</b> to the parish priest.</i>
<b>integral</b>	The result of a mathematical integration $F(x)$ is the integral of $f(x)$ if $dF = f(x) dx$ . <i>Systematic training should be <b>integral</b> to library management.</i>
<b>key</b>	The keyhole shaped area marked on the court near each basket. <i>One <b>key</b> advertisements and measures returns.</i>
<b>leading</b>	Having the leading position or higher score in a contest. <i>The <b>leading</b> team in the pennant race.</i>
<b>main</b>	A principal pipe in a system that distributes water or gas or electricity or that collects sewage. <i>The camcorder can be run directly off the <b>mains</b>.</i>
<b>major</b>	Of a premise containing the major term in a categorical syllogism. <i>The key of D <b>major</b>.</i>
<b>meaningful</b>	Having a meaning or purpose. <i><b>Meaningful</b> glances and repressed passion.</i>
<b>necessity</b>	A situation enforcing a certain course of action. <i>Political <b>necessity</b> induced him to consider it.</i>
<b>prerequisite</b>	Required as a prior condition. <i>Sponsorship is not a <b>prerequisite</b> for any of our courses.</i>
<b>prima</b>	Used primarily as eating apples. <i><b>Prima</b> donna.</i>
<b>primarily</b>	Of primary import. <i>Around 80 per cent of personal computers are used <b>primarily</b> for word processing.</i>

<b><u>primary</u></b>	A primary feather. <i>The government's <b>primary</b> aim is to see significant reductions in unemployment.</i>
<b>prime</b>	A prime number. <i><b>Prime</b> beef.</i>
<b>principal</b>	An actor who plays a principal role. <i>Stockbrokers in Tokyo act as agents rather than as <b>principals</b>.</i>
<b>requisite</b>	Made necessary by particular circumstances or regulations. <i>The application will not be processed until the <b>requisite</b> fee is paid.</i>
<b><u>rudimentary</u></b>	Not fully developed in mature animals. <i>He received a <b>rudimentary</b> education.</i>
<b><u>substantial</u></b>	Having substance or capable of being treated as fact; not imaginary-Shakespeare. <i>A <b>substantial</b> amount of cash.</i>
<b><u>underlying</u></b>	Significant as a cause or basis of something but not necessarily manifest or obvious. <i>The flu can be particularly severe for the elderly and those with <b>underlying</b> conditions.</i>
<b><u>vital</u></b>	Full of spirit. <i>Of <b>vital</b> interest.</i>
