- *A hand tool consisting of a rotating shaft with parallel handle.*
- *A plan or idea that has a chance of succeeding and is therefore worthy of consideration.*
- *A contestant in a team sport who is in the game at the beginning.*
- *An automatic device for starting a machine, especially the engine of a vehicle.*
- *The official who signals the beginning of a race or competition.*
- *A person or thing that starts in a specified way.*
- *An electric motor for starting an engine.*
- *The first course of a meal.*
- *The pitcher who starts the game.*
- *A culture containing yeast or bacteria that is used to start the process of fermentation or souring in making butter or cheese or dough.*

- *A railway signal controlling the starting of trains from a station or other location.*
- *A person who gives the signal for the start of a race.*
- *A topic, question, or other item with which to start a group discussion or course of study.*
- *Denoting something regarded as suitable for a person who is new to a particular activity, product, etc.*
- *Any new participant in some activity.*
- *A preparation of chemicals to initiate the breakdown of vegetable matter in making compost.*
- *A mixture of fermenting dough reserved from an earlier batch of baking, used to initiate fermentation in fresh dough.*
- *Food or drink to stimulate the appetite (usually served before a meal or as the first course).*

apprentice	A beginner. <i>An apprentice barman.</i>
beginner	A person who founds or establishes some institution. <i>An absolute beginner.</i>
canapé	An appetizer consisting usually of a thin slice of bread or toast spread with caviar or cheese or other savory food.
crank	A bad-tempered person. <i>A long con rod which acts as a longer lever on the crank.</i>
dispatcher	Killing a person or animal. <i>He told the dispatcher that his wife wasn't breathing.</i>
entrant	A commodity that enters competition with established merchandise. <i>The prize will be awarded to the entrant who wins the tiebreak.</i>
finger food	The length of breadth of a finger used as a linear measure.
first course	The lowest forward gear ratio in the gear box of a motor vehicle; used to start a car moving.
fledgeling	Young bird that has just fledged or become capable of flying.
fledgling	A young bird that has just fledged. <i>The country's fledgling democracy.</i>
freshman	A first-year student at high school. <i>We invited the freshmen.</i>
learner	A person who is learning to drive a motor vehicle and has not yet passed a driving test. <i>A fast learner.</i>
neophyte	Any new participant in some activity. <i>A cast of neophyte actors.</i>
newbie	Any new participant in some activity.
newcomer	A novice in a particular activity or situation. <i>He's a newcomer to Boston.</i>
novice	A person who has entered a religious order and is under probation, before taking vows. <i>The novice hurdles.</i>
novitiate	A place housing religious novices.
probationer	A nurse in training who is undergoing a trial period.

pupil	A learner who is enrolled in an educational institution. <i>Will you take me on as your pupil.</i>
raw recruit	Informal terms for nakedness.
savoury	A savoury dish especially a snack or appetizer. <i>Refreshments include cakes and savouries.</i>
snack	A thing that is easy to accomplish. <i>Bar snacks are served at lunchtime.</i>
starter motor	The official who signals the beginning of a race or competition.
starting motor	A turn to be a starter (in a game at the beginning.
student	A person who is studying at a university or other place of higher education. <i>Student loans.</i>
titbit	A small piece of tasty food. <i>They were hoping for titbits about the family.</i>
trainee	Someone who is being trained. <i>Trainee solicitors.</i>
tyro	A beginner or novice.

entrant	A commodity that enters competition with established merchandise. <i>The prize will be awarded to the entrant who wins the tiebreak.</i>
fledgling	Having acquired its flight feathers. <i>A fledgling enterprise.</i>
founder	A worker who makes metal castings. <i>The horses founded.</i>
freshen	Make (something) newer, cleaner, or more attractive. <i>The waitress freshened their coffee.</i>
freshman	A first-year undergraduate. <i>Freshman year in high school or college.</i>
grader	A judge who assigns grades to something. <i>A first grader.</i>
laity	Lay people, as distinct from the clergy.
layman	Someone who is not a clergyman or a professional person. <i>He was an active Catholic layman.</i>
learner	Works for an expert to learn a trade. <i>A fast learner.</i>
meal	The food eaten during a meal. <i>The evening meal.</i>
neophyte	A new convert being taught the principles of Christianity by a catechist. <i>A cast of neophyte actors.</i>
nestling	A young person of either sex. <i>Buntings their throats bulging with food for hungry nestlings.</i>
newbie	Any new participant in some activity.
newcomer	Any new participant in some activity. <i>He s a newcomer to Boston.</i>
noodle	A very thin, long strip of pasta or a similar flour paste, eaten with a sauce or in a soup. <i>Cook the noodles in a large pan of boiling water.</i>
novice	Someone new to a field or activity. <i>Last season as a novice he won three races.</i>
pie	Dish baked in pastry-lined pan often with a pastry top. <i>A meat pie.</i>
prentice	Works for an expert to learn a trade. <i>My brother was prenticed to a wheelwright.</i>
rookie	An awkward and inexperienced youth. <i>A rookie cop.</i>

- salad** A mixture containing a specified ingredient served with a dressing.

- sophomore** A second-year undergraduate.
*Their **sophomore** year in college.*
- soup** Any composition having a consistency suggestive of soup.
