## Associations of "Startled" (30 Words)

<b>abominable</b>	Exceptionally bad or displeasing. <i><b>Abominable</b> treatment of prisoners.</i>
<a href="#"><b>acquaint</b></a>	Cause to come to know personally. <i>New staff should be <b>acquainted</b> with fire exit routes.</i>
<b>aghast</b>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation. <i>She winced <b>aghast</b> at his cruelty.</i>
<b>amazed</b>	Greatly surprised; astonished. <i>I was <b>amazed</b> that he could remember me.</i>
<b>astonish</b>	Affect with wonder. <i>It <b>astonished</b> her that he was so anxious.</i>
<a href="#"><b>astonished</b></a>	Greatly surprised or impressed; amazed. <i>We were <b>astonished</b> to hear of this decision.</i>
<a href="#"><b>astonishing</b></a>	Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing. <i>The dog was capable of <b>astonishing</b> tricks.</i>
<b>astounded</b>	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i><b>Astounded</b> viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.</i>
<b>bemuse</b>	Cause to be confused emotionally. <i>He was <b>bemused</b> by what was happening.</i>
<b>curious</b>	(of books) erotic or pornographic. <i>Traffic was slowed by <b>curious</b> rubberneckers.</i>
<a href="#"><b>dismayed</b></a>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<a href="#"><b>flabbergasted</b></a>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i><b>Flabbergasted</b> fans took to the streets to celebrate the team's big win.</i>
<b>inform</b>	Give incriminating information about someone to the police or other authority. <i>They were <b>informed</b> that no risk was involved.</i>

<b>notification</b>	A request for payment. <i>The <b>notification</b> stated the grace period and the penalties for defaulting.</i>
<b>puzzled</b>	Unable to understand; perplexed. <i>She looked <b>puzzled</b> and angry with him.</i>
<b>quizzical</b>	Perplexed (as if being expected to know something that you do not know). <i>His face wore a somewhat <b>quizzical</b> almost impertinent air.</i>
<b>reactant</b>	A chemical substance that is present at the start of a chemical reaction.
<b>reaction</b>	A response that reveals a person's feelings or attitude. <i>A skilled driver with quick <b>reactions</b>.</i>
<b>redoubtable</b>	Inspiring fear. <i>A tougher and more <b>redoubtable</b> adversary than the heel clicking jackbooted fanatic.</i>
<b>response</b>	A verbal or written answer. <i>An Honours degree course in Japanese has been established in <b>response</b> to an increasing demand.</i>
<b>responsiveness</b>	The quality of being responsive; reacting quickly; as a quality of people, it involves responding with emotion to people and events. <i>A bank's <b>responsiveness</b> to customer problems engenders trust.</i>
<b>shattered</b>	Ruined or disrupted. <i>I usually feel too <b>shattered</b> to do more than crawl into bed.</i>
<b>shocked</b>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<b>shocking</b>	Giving offense to moral sensibilities and injurious to reputation- Thackeray. <i>The most <b>shocking</b> book of its time.</i>
<b>surprise</b>	Cause to be surprised. <i>I was <b>surprised</b> at his statement.</i>
<b>surprised</b>	Feeling or showing surprise. <i>A <b>surprised</b> expression.</i>
<b>telegram</b>	A message transmitted by telegraph.
<b>tip</b>	Mark with a tip. <i><b>Tip</b> the arrow with the small stone.</i>
<b>wondering</b>	Showing curiosity. <i>Peter listened with an air of <b>wondering</b> astonishment.</i>
<b>yeah</b>	Not only so, but.
