inauguration The ceremonial induction into a position.
*The **inauguration** of an independent prosecution service.*

- begin** Begin to speak or say he began.
*This economic measure doesn't even **begin** to deal with the problem of inflation.*
- beginning** The point in time or space at which something begins.
*He had risen from humble **beginnings** to great wealth.*
- ceremony** Any activity that is performed in an especially solemn elaborate or formal way.
*He makes a **ceremony** of addressing his golf ball.*
- chime** Emit a sound.
*The warm breeze whispered through the **chimes** hanging from the balcony ceiling.*
- commence** Take the first step or steps in carrying out an action.
*His design team **commenced** work.*

<u>commencement</u>	The act of starting something. <i>The date of commencement.</i>
commercialize	Manage or exploit (an organization, activity, etc.) in a way designed to make a profit. <i>Some Amish people have commercialized their way of life.</i>
ding	Go ding dong like a bell. <i>Cash registers were dinging softly.</i>
inaugural	An address delivered at an inaugural ceremony especially by a United States president. <i>His inaugural concert as Music Director.</i>
inaugurate	Commence officially. <i>The museum was inaugurated on September 12.</i>
inauguration	The beginning or introduction of a system, policy, or period. <i>The inauguration of the Modern Art Museum.</i>
<u>incipient</u>	Only partly in existence; imperfectly formed. <i>Incipient civil disorder.</i>
initiate	A person who has been initiated into an organization or activity. <i>They were initiated into the mysteries of mathematics.</i>
<u>initiative</u>	Serving to set in motion. <i>The initiative phase in the negotiations.</i>
intro	A brief introductory passage to a piece of popular music.
jingle	A light ringing sound such as that made by metal objects being shaken together. <i>He jingled the coins in his purse.</i>
jut	The act of projecting out from something. <i>She put up her head and jutted out her chin with determination.</i>
launch	Launch for the first time launch on a maiden voyage. <i>He launched a biting attack on BBC chiefs.</i>
<u>midnight</u>	Twelve o'clock at night. <i>The midnight hours.</i>
officially	In a formal and public way. <i>On June 24 the election campaign will officially begin.</i>
open	Of textures full of small openings or gaps. <i>I m keeping an open mind about my future.</i>
opened	Made open or clear. <i>The newly opened road.</i>

opening	The act of opening something. <i>The play s opening scene.</i>
outset	The start or beginning of something. <i>The project was flawed from the outset.</i>
papacy	The government of the Roman Catholic Church. <i>A papacy in decline.</i>
pioneer	Open up a road or terrain as a pioneer. <i>This South African surgeon pioneered heart transplants.</i>
rocket	Attack with rocket propelled missiles. <i>Sales of milk in supermarkets are rocketing.</i>
run	Run with the ball in such sports as football. <i>A shallow run at the edge of a low rock.</i>
start	A turn to be a starter in a game at the beginning. <i>The season starts in September.</i>
trailblazer	Someone who helps to open up a new line of research or technology or art. <i>He was a trailblazer for many ideas that are now standard fare.</i>
