#### Definitions of "Starve" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "starve" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Have a craving, appetite, or great desire for.
- Deprive of something necessary.
- Suffer or die or cause to suffer or die from hunger.
- Force someone out of (a place) or into (a specified state) by starvation.
- Be freezing cold.
- Deprive of food.
- Feel very hungry.
- Deprive of a necessity and cause suffering.
- Be hungry; go without food.
- Die of food deprivation.
