- Suffering or dying from hunger.
- Suffering from lack of food.

dying from lack of food Eagerly desirous.dying of hunger Eagerly desirous.

faint from lack of food Deficient in magnitude; barely perceptible; lacking clarity or

brightness or loudness etc.

malnourished Not being provided with adequate nourishment.

starved Suffering from lack of food.

The family was **starved** and ragged.

Having insufficient food or other substances for good health and

undernourished condition.

Badly undernourished.

unfed Not given support.

A grudge that remained unfed.

Many **famish**ed in the countryside during the drought.

famished Extremely hungry.

I m **famished** is there anything to eat.

fasting Abstaining from food.

A person who is devoted to eating and drinking to excess.

He s a **glutton** for adventure.

gluttonous Excessively greedy.

A **gluttonous** appetite for food and praise and pleasure.

hunger Feel or suffer hunger.

When he had fasted forty days and forty nights he afterwards **hunger**ed.

hungry (usually followed by `for') extremely desirous.

I always find art galleries **hungry** work.

impecunious Having little or no money.

A titled but **impecunious** family.

malnourished Not being provided with adequate nourishment.

orphan Make a child an orphan.

He was left an **orphan** as a small boy.

(of a person) having no money; very poor.

pennilessA penniless young student.

povertyThe state of being inferior in quality or insufficient in amount.

The **poverty** of her imagination.

(of hunger or need) very great; voracious.

A ravenous appetite.

repletion Eating until excessively full.

satietyThe feeling or state of being sated.

A molecule that seems to regulate **satiety**.

skinny A pair of skinny jeans or trousers.

In the winter I live in **skinny** jeans and boots.

starve Deprive of a necessity and cause suffering.

Seven million **starve**d to death.

stomach Any of a number of organs analogous to the stomach in lower animals.

She doesn t have the **stomach** *to eat anything.*

Torment or tease (someone) with the sight or promise of something that is

tantalize unobtainable.

She still **tantalize**d him.



Have a craving, appetite, or great desire for. thirst

He is oblivious to all the **thirst** around him.

(usually followed by `for') extremely desirous. **thirsty**

Thirsty towels.

Being very thin. underweight

We feared the hot air balloon had been **underweight**ed.

(of a person's attitude or behaviour) not sensible or well balanced. unhealthy

An **unhealthy** climate.

Impossible to quench. unquenchable

Unquenchable thirst.

Excessively greedy and grasping. voracious

Voracious sharks.
