<b>formal</b>	Being in accord with established forms and conventions and requirements as e g of formal dress. <i>Pay one s <b>formal</b> respects.</i>
<b>glorious</b>	Having or deserving or conferring glory. <i><b>Glorious</b> platters of succulent crabs.</i>
<b>grand</b>	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks. <i><b>Grand</b> staircase.</i>
<b><u>imperial</u></b>	Majestic or magnificent. <i>The bedroom is huge and very <b>imperial</b>.</i>
<b>important</b>	Important in effect or meaning. <i>It is <b>important</b> to avoid monosyllabic answers.</i>
<b>imposing</b>	Grand and impressive in appearance. <i>An <b>imposing</b> residence.</i>
<b><u>impressive</u></b>	Producing a strong effect. <i>An <b>impressive</b> view of the mountains.</i>
<b>magnificent</b>	Extremely beautiful, elaborate, or impressive. <i>A dramatic landscape of <b>magnificent</b> mountains.</i>
<b>majestic</b>	Majestic in manner or bearing superior to mundane matters. <i>The <b>majestic</b> Canadian Rockies.</i>
<b><u>noble</u></b>	Inert especially toward oxygen. <i>Chardonnay is the <b>noble</b> grape from which some of the finest white wines are produced.</i>
<b>orthodox</b>	Adhering to what is commonly accepted. <i>Burke s views were <b>orthodox</b> in his time.</i>
<b>prescribed</b>	Fixed or established especially by order or command. <i>In <b>prescribed</b> order.</i>
<b>regal</b>	Belonging to or befitting a supreme ruler. <i><b>Regal</b> attire.</i>

*She was **resplendent** in a sea green dress.*
- ritual** Of or relating to or characteristic of religious rituals.  
***Ritual** burial.*
- ritualistic** Invariably performed in the same way.  
*A **ritualistic** act of worship.*
- set** Set down according to a plan.  
*A house **set** on a hilltop.*
- solemn** Not cheerful or smiling; serious.  
*Tim looked very **solemn**.*
- splendid** Magnificent; very impressive.  
*The **splendid** coronation ceremony.*
- statuesque** Of size and dignity suggestive of a statue.  
*Her **statuesque** beauty.*
- traditional** (of jazz) in the style of the early 20th century.  
***Traditional** history.*

<b>splendid</b>	Characterized by grandeur. <i>A <b>splendid</b> view of Windsor Castle.</i>
<b>staid</b>	Sedate, respectable, and unadventurous. <i><b>Staid</b> law firms.</i>
<b>striking</b>	The action of striking. <i>Substantial damage was caused by the <b>striking</b> of a submerged object.</i>
<b>sublime</b>	Cause a substance to sublime. <i>A sense of the <b>sublime</b>.</i>
<b>superb</b>	Used in names of birds with attractive or colourful plumage e.g superb lyrebird. <i>A <b>superb</b> performance.</i>
