ceremonious	Characterized by pomp and ceremony and stately display. <i>A Great Hall where ceremonious and public appearances were made.</i>
conventional	Represented in simplified or symbolic form. <i>A conventional view of the world.</i>
courtly	Very polite or refined, as befitting a royal court. <i>A courtly gentleman.</i>

dignified	Having or expressing dignity; especially formality or stateliness in bearing or appearance. <i>Her dignified demeanor.</i>
elegant	Refined and tasteful in appearance or behavior or style. <i>She will look elegant in black.</i>
fixed	Fixed and unmoving. <i>How s the club fixed for money now.</i>
formal	Being in accord with established forms and conventions and requirements as e g of formal dress. <i>Pay one s formal respects.</i>
glorious	Having or deserving or conferring glory. <i>Glorious platters of succulent crabs.</i>
grand	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks. <i>Grand staircase.</i>
<u>imperial</u>	Majestic or magnificent. <i>The bedroom is huge and very imperial.</i>
important	Important in effect or meaning. <i>It is important to avoid monosyllabic answers.</i>
imposing	Grand and impressive in appearance. <i>An imposing residence.</i>
<u>impressive</u>	Producing a strong effect. <i>An impressive view of the mountains.</i>
magnificent	Extremely beautiful, elaborate, or impressive. <i>A dramatic landscape of magnificent mountains.</i>
majestic	Majestic in manner or bearing superior to mundane matters. <i>The majestic Canadian Rockies.</i>
<u>noble</u>	Inert especially toward oxygen. <i>Chardonnay is the noble grape from which some of the finest white wines are produced.</i>
orthodox	Adhering to what is commonly accepted. <i>Burke s views were orthodox in his time.</i>
prescribed	Fixed or established especially by order or command. <i>In prescribed order.</i>
regal	Belonging to or befitting a supreme ruler. <i>Regal attire.</i>

- resplendent** Having great beauty and splendor.
*She was **resplendent** in a sea green dress.*
- ritual** Of or relating to or characteristic of religious rituals.
***Ritual** burial.*
- ritualistic** Invariably performed in the same way.
*A **ritualistic** act of worship.*
- set** Set down according to a plan.
*A house **set** on a hilltop.*
- solemn** Not cheerful or smiling; serious.
*Tim looked very **solemn**.*
- splendid** Magnificent; very impressive.
*The **splendid** coronation ceremony.*
- statuesque** Of size and dignity suggestive of a statue.
*Her **statuesque** beauty.*
- traditional** (of jazz) in the style of the early 20th century.
***Traditional** history.*

- dignify** Give an impressive name to (someone or something unworthy of it).
*I shall not **dignify** this insensitive remark with an answer.*

exceeding	Extremely exceedingly. <i>An ale of exceeding poor quality.</i>
grand	A grand piano. <i>A grand niece.</i>
grandeur	The quality of being magnificent or splendid or grand. <i>His facade of grandeur.</i>
gravitas	Dignity, seriousness, or solemnity of manner. <i>A post for which he has the expertise and the gravitas.</i>
huge	Extremely popular or successful. <i>Huge popular demand for higher education.</i>
imposing	Grand and impressive in appearance. <i>An imposing 17th century manor house.</i>
impressive	Making a strong or vivid impression. <i>Impressive achievements in science.</i>
luxury	Luxurious or of the nature of a luxury. <i>A luxury yacht.</i>
magisterial	Domineering; dictatorial. <i>He dropped his somewhat magisterial style of questioning.</i>
magnificent	Very good; excellent. <i>A dramatic landscape of magnificent mountains.</i>
majestic	Majestic in manner or bearing superior to mundane matters. <i>His majestic presence.</i>
noble	Especially in former times a person of noble rank or birth. <i>The promotion of human rights was a noble aspiration.</i>
opulence	Great wealth or luxuriousness. <i>Rooms of spectacular opulence.</i>
peremptory	Insisting on immediate attention or obedience, especially in a brusquely imperious way. <i>Peremptory commands.</i>
prosperity	An economic state of growth with rising profits and full employment. <i>A long period of peace and prosperity.</i>
saintliness	The quality of resembling a saint. <i>Her selfless behaviour borders on saintliness.</i>
serious	Substantial in terms of size, number, or quality. <i>He bridges the gap between serious and popular music.</i>
solemn	Characterized by deep sincerity. <i>The judge was solemn as he pronounced sentence.</i>

solemnity	A formal, dignified rite or ceremony. <i>His ashes were laid to rest with great solemnity.</i>
spectacular	Characteristic of spectacles or drama. <i>A spectacular display of northern lights.</i>
splendid	Characterized by grandeur. <i>A splendid view of Windsor Castle.</i>
staid	Sedate, respectable, and unadventurous. <i>Staid law firms.</i>
striking	The action of striking. <i>Substantial damage was caused by the striking of a submerged object.</i>
sublime	Cause a substance to sublime. <i>A sense of the sublime.</i>
superb	Used in names of birds with attractive or colourful plumage e.g superb lyrebird. <i>A superb performance.</i>
wonderful	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>The climate was wonderful all the year round.</i>
