## Static as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Static" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "static" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a memory or store) not needing to be periodically refreshed by an applied voltage.*
- *Not in physical motion.*
- *Showing little if any change.*
- *Acting as weight but not moving.*
- *Lacking in movement, action, or change, especially in an undesirable or uninteresting way.*
- *Relating to statics.*
- *Concerned with or producing or caused by static electricity.*
- *Concerned with bodies at rest or forces in equilibrium.*
- *(of an electric charge) having gathered on or in an object that cannot conduct a*



current.

- (of a process or variable) not able to be changed during a set period, for example while a program is running.

<b>changeless</b>	Unvarying in nature. <i><b>Changeless</b> truths.</i>
<b><u>consistent</u></b>	In agreement or consistent or reliable. <i>The parents are being <b>consistent</b> and firm in their reactions.</i>
<b>constant</b>	Occurring continuously over a period of time. <i>A <b>constant</b> friend.</i>
<b>electrostatic</b>	Relating to stationary electric charges or fields as opposed to electric currents. <i>An <b>electrostatic</b> generator produces high voltage static electricity.</i>

<b>fixed</b>	Fixed and unmoving. <i>Living on <b>fixed</b> incomes.</i>
<b>inactive</b>	Not working; inoperative. <i>Desired amounts of <b>inactive</b> chlorine.</i>
<b>invariable</b>	(of a quantity) constant. <i>His <b>invariable</b> courtesy.</i>
<b><u>motionless</u></b>	Not in physical motion. <i>An eagle hung almost <b>motionless</b> close to the ground.</i>
<b><u>stable</u></b>	Showing little if any change. <i>Isocyanic acid reacts with amino groups to form a <b>stable</b> compound.</i>
<b><u>steady</u></b>	Regular, even, and continuous in development, frequency, or intensity. <i>A solid <b>steady</b> young man.</i>
<b>still</b>	(of air, water, or the weather) undisturbed by wind, sound, or current; calm and tranquil. <i>A <b>still</b> pond.</i>
<b><u>unchanged</u></b>	Not changed; unaltered. <i>An <b>unchanged</b> side for tonight's home game.</i>
<b><u>unchanging</u></b>	Not changing; remaining the same. <i>The party stood for <b>unchanging</b> principles.</i>
<b>undeviating</b>	Going directly ahead from one point to another without veering or turning aside. <i>The <b>undeviating</b> loyalty of his wife.</i>
<b><u>uniform</u></b>	Denoting a garment forming part of a person's uniform. <i>A <b>uniform</b> package of amenities at a choice of hotels.</i>
<b>unvarying</b>	Unvarying in nature. <i>The <b>unvarying</b> routine of parsonage life.</i>

<b>constancy</b>	The quality of being faithful and dependable. <i>Early mariners relied on the <b>constancy</b> of the trade winds.</i>
<b>fixed</b>	Fixed and unmoving Connor Cruise O'Brien. <i>A <b>fixed</b> smile.</i>
<b>immobile</b>	Securely fixed in place. <i>An <b>immobile</b> workforce.</i>
<b><u>immovable</u></b>	Immovable property. <i>An <b>immovable</b> article of faith.</i>
<b>immutable</b>	Constant and unchanging. <i>An <b>immutable</b> fact.</i>



<b>lint</b>	The fibrous material of a cotton boll. <i>Some fabrics leave tiny specks of <b>lint</b> on the glass.</i>
<b>lull</b>	Make calm or still. <i>There was a <b>lull</b> in the storm.</i>
<b><u>motionless</u></b>	Not moving; stationary. <i>An eagle hung almost <b>motionless</b> close to the ground.</i>
<b>preside</b>	Act as president. <i><b>Preside</b> over companies and corporations.</i>
<b>quiescent</b>	Not active or activated. <i>Strikes were headed by groups of workers who had previously been <b>quiescent</b>.</i>
<b>quiet</b>	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>Sit here as <b>quiet</b> as you can.</i>
<b><u>resolute</u></b>	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. <i>Faced with a <b>resolute</b> opposition.</i>
<b><u>sedentary</u></b>	(of a position) sitting; seated. <i>We all walk a certain amount every day even if we are <b>sedentary</b>.</i>
<b>settled</b>	Inhabited by colonists. <i>The advent of <b>settled</b> civilization.</i>
<b><u>stable</u></b>	Shelter in a stable. <i>Prices have remained relatively <b>stable</b>.</i>
<b>standing</b>	Executed in or initiated from a standing position. <i>Their <b>standing</b> in the community.</i>
<b>statics</b>	The branch of mechanics concerned with forces in equilibrium.
<b><u>stationary</u></b>	Not moving or not intended to be moved. <i><b>Stationary</b> machinery.</i>
<b>steadfast</b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i><b>Steadfast</b> loyalty.</i>
<b><u>stiff</u></b>	In a stiff manner. <i>They face <b>stiff</b> fines and a possible jail sentence.</i>
<b>still</b>	An apparatus used for the distillation of liquids consists of a vessel in which a substance is vaporized by heat and a condenser where the vapor is condensed. <i>The <b>still</b> of the night.</i>
<b><u>tranquil</u></b>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. <i><b>Tranquil</b> life in the country.</i>

<b>tranquelize</b>	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to.
<b><u>unchangeable</u></b>	Not changeable or subject to change. <i>The <b>unchangeable</b> seasons.</i>
<b><u>unchanged</u></b>	Not made or become different. <i>An <b>unchanged</b> side for tonight s home game.</i>
<b>unmoving</b>	Not moving; still. <i>Claudia sat <b>unmoving</b> behind her desk.</i>
<b>unshakable</b>	Without flaws or loopholes.
<b>unswerving</b>	Going directly ahead from one point to another without veering or turning aside. <i>A straight and narrow tree lined road <b>unswerving</b> across the lowlands.</i>
<b><u>unwavering</u></b>	Not showing abrupt variations. <i><b>Unwavering</b> loyalty.</i>
