
Static as a Noun

Definitions of "Static" as an adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "static" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- (of a memory or store) not needing to be periodically refreshed by an applied voltage.
- Not in physical motion.
- Showing little if any change.
- Acting as weight but not moving.
- Lacking in movement, action, or change, especially in an undesirable or uninteresting way.
- Relating to statics.
- Concerned with or producing or caused by static electricity.
- Concerned with bodies at rest or forces in equilibrium.
- ullet (of an electric charge) having gathered on or in an object that cannot conduct a



current.

• (of a process or variable) not able to be changed during a set period, for example while a program is running.
