Definitions of "Static" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "static" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a memory or store) not needing to be periodically refreshed by an applied voltage.*
- *Not in physical motion.*
- *Showing little if any change.*
- *Acting as weight but not moving.*
- *Lacking in movement, action, or change, especially in an undesirable or uninteresting way.*
- *Relating to statics.*
- *Concerned with or producing or caused by static electricity.*
- *Concerned with bodies at rest or forces in equilibrium.*
- *(of an electric charge) having gathered on or in an object that cannot conduct a*

current.

- (of a process or variable) not able to be changed during a set period, for example while a program is running.

- constant** Occurring continuously over a period of time.

*An **electrostatic** generator produces high voltage static electricity.*

fixed	Fixed and unmoving. <i>Living on fixed incomes.</i>
inactive	Not working; inoperative. <i>Desired amounts of inactive chlorine.</i>
invariable	(of a quantity) constant. <i>His invariable courtesy.</i>
<u>motionless</u>	Not in physical motion. <i>An eagle hung almost motionless close to the ground.</i>
<u>stable</u>	Showing little if any change. <i>Isocyanic acid reacts with amino groups to form a stable compound.</i>
<u>steady</u>	Regular, even, and continuous in development, frequency, or intensity. <i>A solid steady young man.</i>
still	(of air, water, or the weather) undisturbed by wind, sound, or current; calm and tranquil. <i>A still pond.</i>
<u>unchanged</u>	Not changed; unaltered. <i>An unchanged side for tonight's home game.</i>
<u>unchanging</u>	Not changing; remaining the same. <i>The party stood for unchanging principles.</i>
undeviating	Going directly ahead from one point to another without veering or turning aside. <i>The undeviating loyalty of his wife.</i>
<u>uniform</u>	Denoting a garment forming part of a person's uniform. <i>A uniform package of amenities at a choice of hotels.</i>
unvarying	Unvarying in nature. <i>The unvarying routine of parsonage life.</i>

- *An electrostatic generator produces high-voltage static electricity.*
- *A static population.*
- *The film is vulnerable to the collection of static charges.*
- *The whole ballet appeared too static.*
- *Demand has grown in what was a fairly static market.*

immobile	Securely fixed in place. <i>An immobile workforce.</i>
<u>immovable</u>	Immovable property. <i>An immovable article of faith.</i>
immutable	Constant and unchanging. <i>An immutable fact.</i>

lint	The fibrous material of a cotton boll. <i>Some fabrics leave tiny specks of lint on the glass.</i>
lull	Make calm or still. <i>There was a lull in the storm.</i>
<u>motionless</u>	Not moving; stationary. <i>An eagle hung almost motionless close to the ground.</i>
preside	Act as president. <i>Preside over companies and corporations.</i>
quiescent	Not active or activated. <i>Strikes were headed by groups of workers who had previously been quiescent.</i>
quiet	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>Sit here as quiet as you can.</i>
<u>resolute</u>	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. <i>Faced with a resolute opposition.</i>
<u>sedentary</u>	(of a position) sitting; seated. <i>We all walk a certain amount every day even if we are sedentary.</i>
settled	Inhabited by colonists. <i>The advent of settled civilization.</i>
<u>stable</u>	Shelter in a stable. <i>Prices have remained relatively stable.</i>
standing	Executed in or initiated from a standing position. <i>Their standing in the community.</i>
statics	The branch of mechanics concerned with forces in equilibrium.
<u>stationary</u>	Not moving or not intended to be moved. <i>Stationary machinery.</i>
steadfast	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>Steadfast loyalty.</i>
<u>stiff</u>	In a stiff manner. <i>They face stiff fines and a possible jail sentence.</i>
still	An apparatus used for the distillation of liquids consists of a vessel in which a substance is vaporized by heat and a condenser where the vapor is condensed. <i>The still of the night.</i>
<u>tranquil</u>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. <i>Tranquil life in the country.</i>

tranquelize	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to.
<u>unchangeable</u>	Not changeable or subject to change. <i>The unchangeable seasons.</i>
<u>unchanged</u>	Not made or become different. <i>An unchanged side for tonight s home game.</i>
unmoving	Not moving; still. <i>Claudia sat unmoving behind her desk.</i>
unshakable	Without flaws or loopholes.
unswerving	Going directly ahead from one point to another without veering or turning aside. <i>A straight and narrow tree lined road unswerving across the lowlands.</i>
<u>unwavering</u>	Not showing abrupt variations. <i>Unwavering loyalty.</i>
