annex	An addition to a document. <i>The left bank of the Rhine was annexed by France in 1797.</i>
autonomous	Having the freedom to act independently. <i>An autonomous judiciary.</i>
capitol	The government building in Washington where the United States Senate and the House of Representatives meet.
circumstance	The set of facts or circumstances that surround a situation or event. <i>He was found dead but there were no suspicious circumstances.</i>
citizen	A native or naturalized member of a state or other political community. <i>A British citizen.</i>
citizenship	Conduct as a citizen. <i>Award for good citizenship.</i>
community	Agreement as to goals. <i>The scientific community.</i>
confederation	The act of forming an alliance or confederation. <i>Canada became a confederation in 1867.</i>
countryside	The inhabitants of countryside areas. <i>They explored the surrounding countryside.</i>
enumerate	Determine the number or amount of. <i>There is not space to enumerate all his works.</i>
ethnographic	Relating to the scientific description of peoples and cultures with their customs, habits, and mutual differences. <i>Ethnographical data.</i>
ethnology	The branch of anthropology that deals with the division of humankind into races and with their origins and distribution and distinctive characteristics.

<u>federation</u>	The act of constituting a political unity out of a number of separate states or colonies or provinces so that each member retains the management of its internal affairs. <i>A first step in the federation of Europe.</i>
independence	Freedom from control or influence of another or others. <i>They maintained close relations with England even after independence.</i>
korean	The Altaic language spoken by Koreans.
localization	A determination of the place where something is. <i>Differences in localization of growth control molecules in carcinoma.</i>
<u>national</u>	A national newspaper as opposed to a local one. <i>National forests.</i>
nationality	People having common origins or traditions and often comprising a nation. <i>The change of a name does not discard nationality.</i>
nationally	Extending throughout an entire nation. <i>A nationally recognized brand.</i>
populous	Densely populated. <i>The populous city of Shanghai.</i>
<u>posit</u>	Put in position place. <i>The Professor posits Cohen in his second category of poets.</i>
putrescent	Becoming putrid. <i>The odour of putrescent flesh.</i>
regional	Relating to the regions of a country rather than the capital. <i>Regional and local needs.</i>
scotland	One of the four countries that make up the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland; located on the northern part of the island of Great Britain; famous for bagpipes and plaids and kilts.
<u>specify</u>	Specify as a condition or requirement in a contract or agreement make an express demand or provision in an agreement. <i>Specify the parameters.</i>
surrounding	All round a particular place or thing. <i>Cardiff and the surrounding area.</i>
<u>town</u>	The particular town under consideration especially one's own town. <i>Churchill was in town.</i>
unite	Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief. <i>The two Germanys officially united.</i>
<u>verbalize</u>	Make (a word, especially a noun) into a verb. <i>This depressed patient does not verbalize.</i>
