Definitions of "Statue" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “statue” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A carved or cast figure of a person or animal, especially one that is life-size or larger.*
- *A sculpture representing a human or animal.*



Synonyms of "Statue" as a noun (6 Words)

- effigy** A representation of a person (especially in the form of sculpture).
*A tomb **effigy** of Eleanor of Aquitaine.*
- figure** A shape which is defined by one or more lines in two dimensions (such as a circle or a triangle), or one or more surfaces in three dimensions (such as a sphere or a cuboid), either considered mathematically in geometry or used as a decorative design.
*By 1998 this **figure** had risen to 14 million.*
- figurine** A statuette, especially one of a human form.
- idol** A person or thing that is greatly admired, loved, or revered.
*A soccer **idol**.*

sculpture A work of art made by sculpture.
*The boundary between painting and **sculpture** is displaced.*

statuette A small carved or molded figure.

alabaster Of or resembling alabaster.
***Alabaster** statue.*

anniversary The date on which a romance began in a previous month or week.
*The 75th **anniversary** of the RAF.*

carve Produce (an object, inscription, or design) by cutting into a hard material.
*I **carved** my initials on the tree.*

caryatid A supporting column carved in the shape of a person.

celebration The action of celebrating an important day or event.
*A birthday **celebration**.*

commemorate Recall and show respect for (someone or something).
*This sculpture **commemorates** the victims of the concentration camps.*

effigy	A roughly made model of a person that is made in order to be damaged or destroyed as a protest. <i>The coin bears an effigy of Lincoln.</i>
engrave	Cut (a design) as lines on a metal plate for printing. <i>Engrave a letter.</i>
epigraph	A short quotation or saying at the beginning of a book or chapter, intended to suggest its theme.
etch	The action or process of etching something. <i>The outline of the town was etched against the sky.</i>
gargoyle	An ornament consisting of a grotesquely carved figure of a person or animal.
inscription	A short message (as in a book or musical work or on a photograph) dedicating it to someone or something. <i>The inscription on her headstone.</i>
marble	Used figuratively to refer to something with the smoothness hardness or colour of marble. <i>A pair of dramatic marbles showing dogs attacking a buck.</i>
memorial	A written statement of facts submitted in conjunction with a petition to an authority. <i>A memorial to General Robert E Lee.</i>
memorialize	Preserve the memory of; commemorate. <i>The President memorialized the heroes of the battle.</i>
molding	Sculpture produced by molding.
monument	An enduring and memorable example of something. <i>Recordings that are a monument to the art of playing the piano.</i>
monumental	Of or serving as a monument. <i>Einstein's monumental contributions to physics.</i>
plaque	A small, distinct, typically raised patch or region on or within the body resulting from local damage or deposition of material, such as a fatty deposit on an artery wall in atherosclerosis or a site of localized damage of brain tissue in Alzheimer's disease. <i>Plaque around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.</i>
sculpt	Create by shaping stone or wood or any other hard material. <i>Sculpt a swan out of a block of ice.</i>
sculpture	A work of art made by sculpture. <i>A collection of sculpture.</i>
slab	Remove slabs from a log or tree to prepare it for sawing into planks. <i>A slab of bread and cheese.</i>

statuary	A sculptor. <i>Classical statuary.</i>
statuesque	(of a woman) attractively tall, graceful, and dignified. <i>Her statuesque beauty.</i>
<u>stone</u>	A piece of stone shaped for a purpose especially one of commemoration ceremony or demarcation. <i>Boundary stones.</i>
tercentenary	The three-hundredth anniversary of a significant event. <i>His tercentenary year.</i>
<u>tomb</u>	A place for the burial of a corpse especially beneath the ground and marked by a tombstone. <i>The house was as quiet as a tomb.</i>
triennial	Lasting for or relating to a period of three years. <i>The triennial meeting of the Association.</i>
vandalism	Willful wanton and malicious destruction of the property of others. <i>Surveillance of the building would reduce vandalism and theft.</i>
woodwork	Work made of wood; especially moldings or stairways or furniture. <i>The woodwork was painted blue.</i>
