abide	Dwell. <i>I said I would abide by their decision.</i>
be	Have the quality of being copula used with an adjective or a predicate noun. <i>Let A be a square matrix of order n.</i>
chromatic	Of an instrument able to play all the notes of the chromatic scale. <i>The master of the chromatic harmonica.</i>
clef	A musical notation written on a staff indicating the pitch of the notes following it.
colonial	A house built in colonial style. <i>Corals can be solitary or colonial.</i>
consistent	Marked by an orderly logical and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>A consistent explanation.</i>
continue	Continue a certain state condition or activity. <i>The demonstration continued after a break for lunch.</i>
descant	Sing in descant. <i>I hear the wood thrush piping one mellow descant more.</i>
diatonic	Of a melody or harmony constructed from a diatonic scale.
dwell	A slight regular pause in the motion of a machine. <i>Groups of people still dwell in these caves.</i>
dweller	A person or animal that lives in or at a specified place. <i>City dwellers.</i>
guitar	A stringed instrument usually having six strings; played by strumming or plucking.
inhabit	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of. <i>A bird that inhabits North America.</i>
lag	Cover with lagging to prevent heat loss. <i>A time lag between infection and symptoms.</i>

<u>lifelong</u>	Continuing through life. <i>A lifelong Conservative.</i>
<u>linger</u>	Move to and fro. <i>She let her eyes linger on him suggestively.</i>
live	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of. <i>Can you live on 2000 a month in New York City.</i>
<u>living</u>	Pertaining to living persons. <i>The benefits of country living.</i>
<u>loiter</u>	Stand or wait around without apparent purpose. <i>The weather had tempted them to loiter along the banks of the Cherwell.</i>
octave	The two notes at the extremes of an octave sounding together.
<u>persist</u>	Be persistent refuse to stop. <i>We are persisting with policies that will create jobs for the future.</i>
<u>remain</u>	Stay the same remain in a certain state. <i>He remained unmoved by her tears.</i>
<u>reside</u>	Make one's home in a particular place or community. <i>The meaning of an utterance does not wholly reside in the semantic meaning.</i>
sojourn	Spend a certain length of time; reside temporarily. <i>Her sojourn in Rome.</i>
soprano	A part written for a soprano voice. <i>A good soprano voice.</i>
tarry	Leave slowly and hesitantly. <i>A length of tarry rope.</i>
<u>tenor</u>	A singer with a tenor voice. <i>The Serenade for tenor horn and strings.</i>
tonality	The colour scheme or range of tones used in a picture. <i>The first bar would seem set to create a tonality of C major.</i>
treble	Sing treble. <i>Rents were doubled and probably trebled.</i>
tremolo	A mechanism in an organ producing a tremolo effect.
