<b>constant</b>	A number representing a quantity assumed to have a fixed value in a specified mathematical context. <i>The condition of struggle remained a <b>constant</b>.</i>
<b>constantly</b>	Continuously over a period of time; always. <i><b>Constantly</b> kind and gracious.</i>
<b><u>continually</u></b>	Seemingly without interruption. <i>This information is <b>continually</b> updated.</i>
<b>continued</b>	Without stop or interruption. <i>The <b>continued</b> popularity of Westerns.</i>
<b>continuously</b>	With unflagging resolve. <i>Their performance has <b>continuously</b> improved.</i>
<b><u>diligence</u></b>	Persevering determination to perform a task. <i>Few party members challenge his <b>diligence</b> as an MP.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i><b>Endless</b> ocean wastes.</i>
<b>equable</b>	Not easily irritated. <i>An <b>equable</b> climate.</i>
<b><u>eternal</u></b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>She is an <b>eternal</b> optimist.</i>
<b><u>ever</u></b>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i><b>Ever</b> the man of action he was impatient with intellectuals.</i>
<b><u>forever</u></b>	For a very long or seemingly endless time. <i>She would love him <b>forever</b>.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>Night and day we live with the <b>incessant</b> noise of the city.</i>

<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b><u>invariably</u></b>	In every case or on every occasion; always. <i>Ranch meals are <b>invariably</b> big and hearty.</i>
<b><u>lasting</u></b>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A long <b>lasting</b> friendship.</i>
<b>permanency</b>	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
<b>perpetual</b>	Occurring repeatedly; so frequent as to seem endless and uninterrupted. <i>Deep caves in <b>perpetual</b> darkness.</i>
<b>perpetually</b>	In a way that never ends or changes; constantly. <i>She seems <b>perpetually</b> to have a mournful look on her face.</i>
<b>persistent</b>	Stubbornly unyielding. <i>PCBs are <b>persistent</b> environmental contaminants.</i>
<b>plodding</b>	The act of walking with a slow heavy gait. <i><b>Plodding</b> methodical Ralph Bellamy.</i>
<b><u>steady</u></b>	Make or become steady. <i>A <b>steady</b> drinker.</i>
<b>sustained</b>	Continuing for an extended period or without interruption. <i>Several years of <b>sustained</b> economic growth.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.</i>
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
<b><u>unchanging</u></b>	Showing little if any change. <i>The party stood for <b>unchanging</b> principles.</i>
<b><u>unwavering</u></b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>She fixed him with an <b>unwavering</b> stare.</i>
