- *A hard, strong grey or bluish-grey alloy of iron with carbon and usually other elements, used as a structural and fabricating material.*
- *Knife sharpener consisting of a ridged steel rod.*
- *Used as a symbol or embodiment of strength and firmness.*
- *A cutting or thrusting weapon that has a long metal blade and a hilt with a hand guard.*
- *An alloy of iron with small amounts of carbon; widely used in construction; mechanical properties can be varied over a wide range.*
- *A rod of roughened steel on which knives are sharpened.*

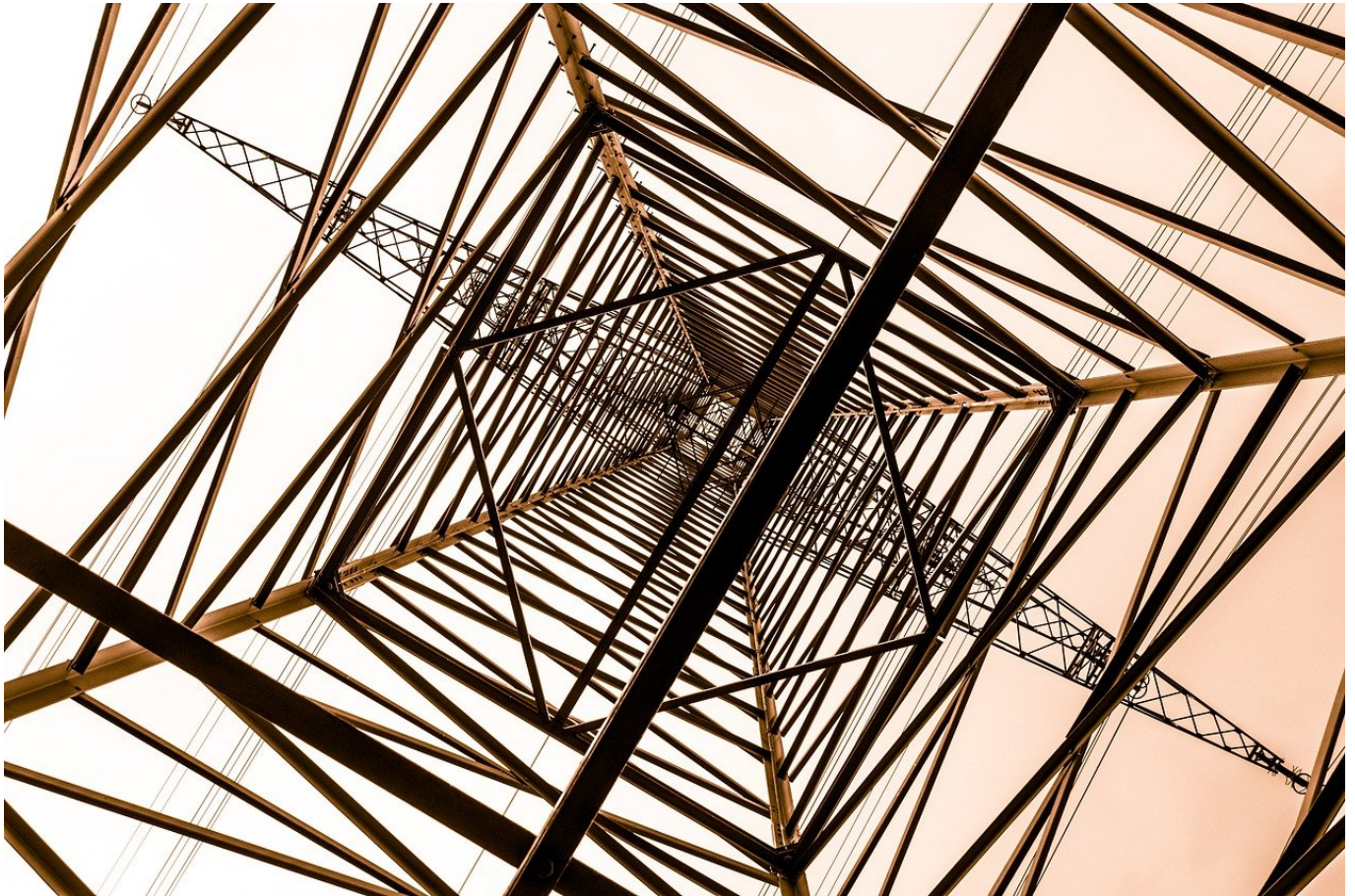


Steel as a Verb

Associations of "Steel" (30 Words)

- auriferous** (of rocks or minerals) containing gold.
***Auriferous** quartz veins.*
- bronze** Give something a surface of bronze or something resembling bronze.
*The doors were **bronzed** with sculpted reliefs.*
- caisson** A floating vessel or watertight structure used as a gate across the entrance of a dry dock or basin.
- can** Preserve in a can or tin.
*We **can** have another drink if you like.*
- cement** Make fast as if with cement.
*Wooden posts were **cemented** into the ground.*

crossbeam	A horizontal beam that extends across something.
crucible	A ceramic or metal container in which metals or other substances may be melted or subjected to very high temperatures. <i>Their relationship was forged in the crucible of war.</i>
escutcheon	A shield; especially one displaying a coat of arms.
ferrous	(chiefly of metals) containing or consisting of iron.
furnace	An enclosed structure in which material can be heated to very high temperatures, e.g. for smelting metals. <i>Her car was a furnace.</i>
girder	A large iron or steel beam or compound structure used for building bridges and the framework of large buildings. <i>The tower is made of steel girders criss crossed to make it stronger.</i>
golden	Suggestive of gold. <i>A golden voice.</i>
grate	Furnish with a grate. <i>Grate carrots and onions.</i>
harden	Harden by reheating and cooling in oil. <i>As oil prices hardened from their recent lows the US dollar fell.</i>
iron	A shot made with an iron. <i>His long irons were majestic.</i>
metallic	A paint fabric or colour with a metallic sheen. <i>Metallic alloys.</i>
molding	Sculpture produced by molding.
nickel	Coat with nickel. <i>A button the size of a nickel.</i>
ore	A monetary subunit in Denmark and Norway and Sweden 100 ore equal 1 krona. <i>A good deposit of lead bearing ores.</i>
oxide	Any compound of oxygen with another element or a radical. <i>Nitrogen oxide.</i>
pole	Propel with a pole. <i>New poles should be protected from grazing livestock.</i>
railing	Material for making rails or rails collectively. <i>Wrought iron railings.</i>
rod	Any rod shaped bacterium. <i>The roof is formed of willow and hazel rods woven between willow rafters.</i>

smelt	Extract a metal from ore by smelting. <i>Coal was used to smelt the steel for the tinsplate.</i>
sulfide	A compound of sulphur and some other element that is more electropositive.
tin	A silvery malleable metallic element that resists corrosion used in many alloys and to coat other metals to prevent corrosion obtained chiefly from cassiterite where it occurs as tin oxide. <i>Grease a 450g loaf tin.</i>
tinsplate	A thin sheet of metal (iron or steel) coated with tin to prevent rusting; used especially for cans, pots, and tins.
zinc	A bluish white lustrous metallic element brittle at ordinary temperatures but malleable when heated used in a wide variety of alloys and in galvanizing iron it occurs naturally as zinc sulphide in zinc blende. <i>A zinc roof.</i>
