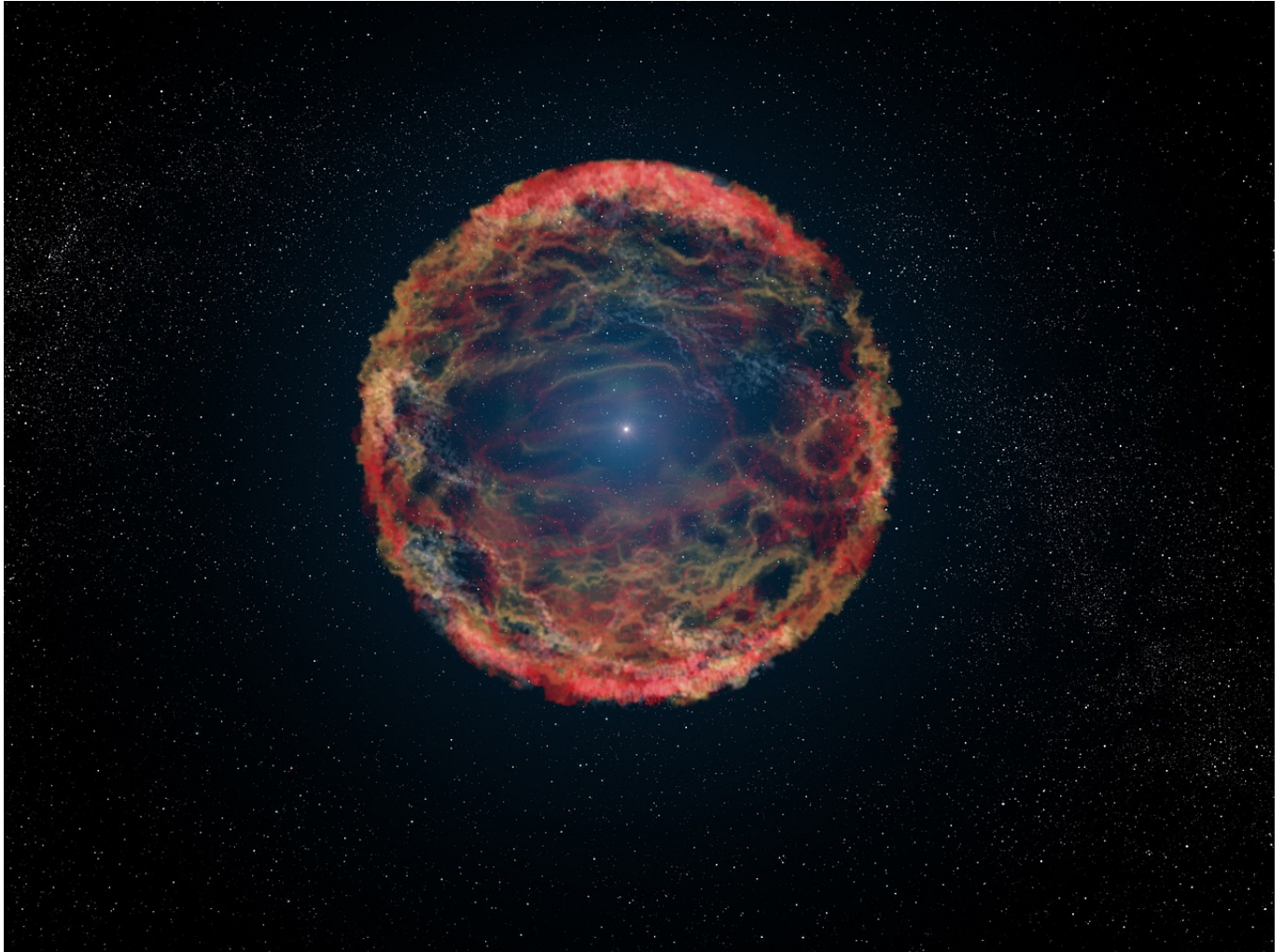

<b><u>cosmic</u></b>	Of or from or pertaining to or characteristic of the cosmos or universe. <i><b>Cosmic</b> matter.</i>
<b>exceptional</b>	Far beyond what is usual in magnitude or degree. <i>Late claims will only be accepted in <b>exceptional</b> circumstances.</i>
<b>extraordinary</b>	(of an official) specially employed in addition to the usual staff. <i>Young children need <b>extraordinary</b> amounts of attention.</i>
<b>leading</b>	Having the leading position or higher score in a contest. <i>The country's <b>leading</b> poet.</i>
<b>magnificent</b>	Characterized by grandeur. <i><b>Magnificent</b> cathedrals.</i>
<b>marvellous</b>	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>These <b>marvellous</b> technological toys are fun to play with.</i>
<b><u>miraculous</u></b>	Peculiarly fortunate or appropriate; as if by divine intervention. <i>I felt amazed and grateful for our <b>miraculous</b> escape.</i>
<b>outstanding</b>	Owed as a debt. <i><b>Outstanding</b> bills.</i>
<b>prima</b>	Indicating the most important performer or role. <i><b>Prima</b> ballerina.</i>
<b>remarkable</b>	Worthy of attention; striking. <i>A <b>remarkable</b> achievement.</i>
<b><u>sensational</u></b>	Causing great public interest and excitement. <i>A <b>sensational</b> view.</i>
<b><u>singular</u></b>	Relating to or of the nature of singularity. <i><b>Singular</b> behavior.</i>
<b><u>staggering</u></b>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The amount of money required was <b>staggering</b>.</i>
<b><u>star</u></b>	Indicating the most important performer or role. <i>The <b>starring</b> role.</i>
<b>starring</b>	Denoting a principal role or performer in a film, play, or other show. <i>The <b>starring</b> characters were Fatty and Fudge.</i>
<b>stunning</b>	Extremely impressive or attractive. <i>A <b>stunning</b> detonation with volumes of black smoke.</i>
<b>wonderful</b>	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>The climate was <b>wonderful</b> all the year round.</i>

- asterisk** Mark with an asterisk.

- astral** Relating to or resembling the stars.  
*An **astral** body.*
- astrologer** A person who uses astrology to tell others about their character or to predict their future.  
*He was advised by **astrologers** to delay his departure.*

<b>astrology</b>	The study of the movements and relative positions of celestial bodies interpreted as having an influence on human affairs and the natural world.
<b>astronomer</b>	An expert in or student of astronomy.
<b>astronomical</b>	Relating or belonging to the science of astronomy. <i><b>Astronomical</b> observations.</i>
<b>astronomy</b>	The branch of physics that studies celestial bodies and the universe as a whole.
<b>capricorn</b>	A faint zodiacal constellation in the southern hemisphere; between Sagittarius and Aquarius.
<b>constellation</b>	A group of stars forming a recognizable pattern that is traditionally named after its apparent form or identified with a mythological figure. <i>No two patients ever show exactly the same <b>constellation</b> of symptoms.</i>
<b>cosmic</b>	Of or from or pertaining to or characteristic of the cosmos or universe. <i>The <b>cosmic</b> void.</i>
<b>cosmogony</b>	The branch of astrophysics that studies the origin and evolution and structure of the universe. <i>In their <b>cosmogony</b> the world was thought to be a square flat surface.</i>
<b>cosmos</b>	Any of various mostly Mexican herbs of the genus Cosmos having radiate heads of variously colored flowers and pinnate leaves; popular fall-blooming annuals. <i>He sat staring deep into the void reminding himself of man s place in the <b>cosmos</b>.</i>
<b>galaxy</b>	The galaxy of which the solar system is a part the Milky Way. <i>The four musicians have played with a <b>galaxy</b> of stars.</i>
<b>horoscope</b>	A forecast of a person's future, typically including a delineation of character and circumstances, based on the relative positions of the stars and planets at the time of that person's birth. <i>He gave lectures on astrology and cast <b>horoscopes</b> in his spare time.</i>
<b>libra</b>	The seventh sign of the zodiac; the sun is in this sign from about September 23 to October 22.
<b>lunar</b>	Of or relating to or associated with the moon. <i>A <b>lunar</b> eclipse.</i>
<b>macrocosm</b>	The whole of a complex structure, especially the world or the universe, contrasted with a small or representative part of it.
<b>nebula</b>	(pathology) a faint cloudy spot on the cornea.
<b>observatory</b>	A building designed and equipped to observe astronomical phenomena.

- planetarium** An optical device for projecting images of celestial bodies and other astronomical phenomena onto the inner surface of a hemispherical dome.
- planetary** Relating to the earth as a planet.  
*The laws of **planetary** motion.*
- sidereal** Determined by daily motion of the stars.
- spaceman** An astronaut.
- star** Be the star in a performance.  
*His golf destiny was written in the **stars**.*
- supernova** A star that explodes and becomes extremely luminous in the process.
- telescope** Crush together or collapse.  
*In the accident the cars **telescoped**.*
- universe** All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago.  
*They study the evolution of the **universe**.*
- virgo** A person who is born while the sun is in Virgo.
