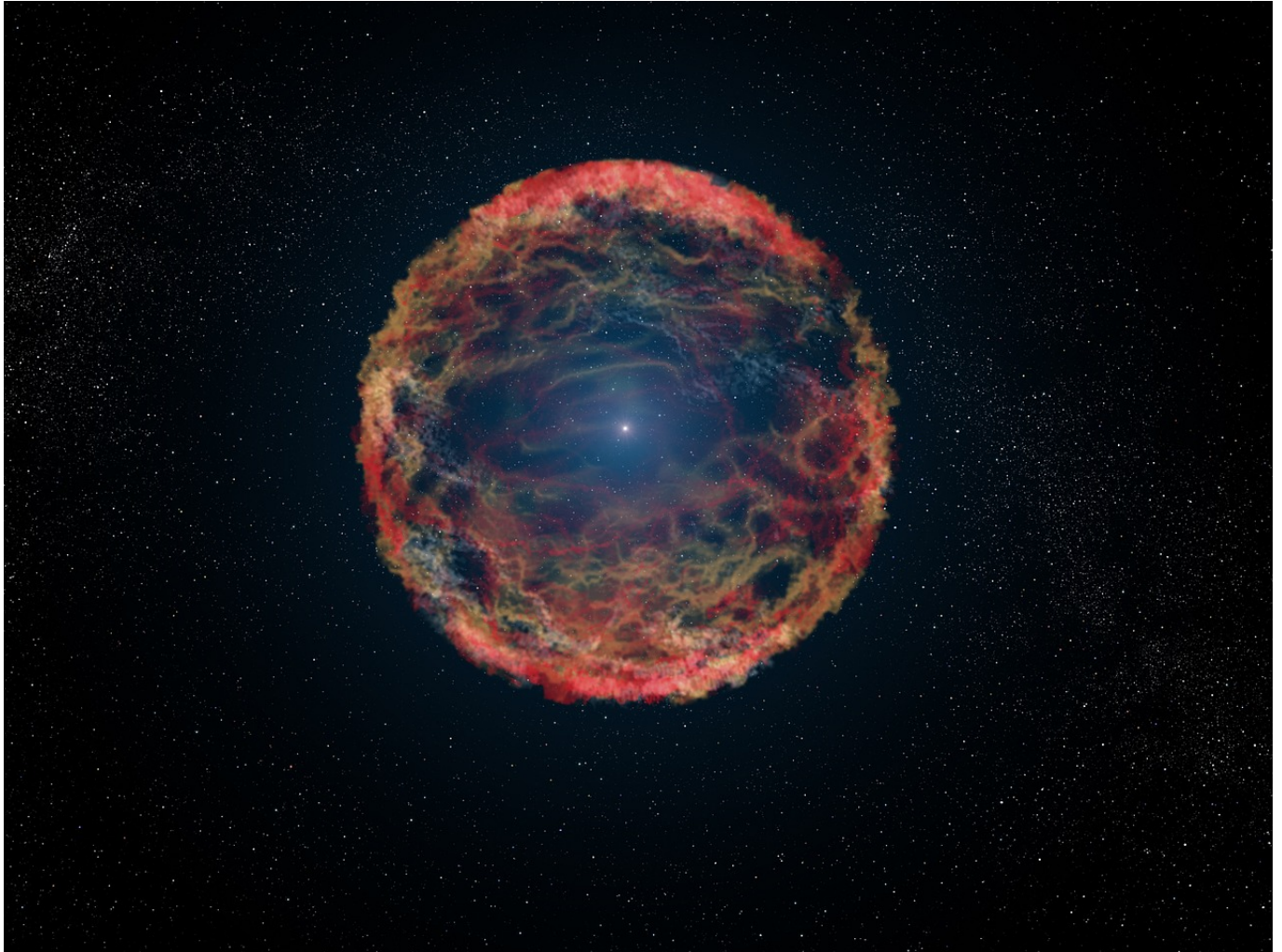
amazing	Very impressive; excellent. <i>She makes the most amazing cakes.</i>
<u>astonishing</u>	Surprising greatly. <i>The dog was capable of astonishing tricks.</i>
<u>astounding</u>	Bewildering or striking dumb with wonder. <i>An astounding achievement.</i>
<u>astral</u>	Relating to or resembling the stars. <i>Astral navigation.</i>
<u>brehtaking</u>	Tending to cause suspension of regular breathing. <i>Brehtaking adventure.</i>
<u>celestial</u>	Positioned in or relating to the sky, or outer space as observed in astronomy. <i>Celestial peace.</i>

<u>cosmic</u>	Of or from or pertaining to or characteristic of the cosmos or universe. <i>Cosmic matter.</i>
exceptional	Far beyond what is usual in magnitude or degree. <i>Late claims will only be accepted in exceptional circumstances.</i>
extraordinary	(of an official) specially employed in addition to the usual staff. <i>Young children need extraordinary amounts of attention.</i>
leading	Having the leading position or higher score in a contest. <i>The country's leading poet.</i>
magnificent	Characterized by grandeur. <i>Magnificent cathedrals.</i>
marvellous	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>These marvellous technological toys are fun to play with.</i>
<u>miraculous</u>	Peculiarly fortunate or appropriate; as if by divine intervention. <i>I felt amazed and grateful for our miraculous escape.</i>
outstanding	Owed as a debt. <i>Outstanding bills.</i>
prima	Indicating the most important performer or role. <i>Prima ballerina.</i>
remarkable	Worthy of attention; striking. <i>A remarkable achievement.</i>
<u>sensational</u>	Causing great public interest and excitement. <i>A sensational view.</i>
<u>singular</u>	Relating to or of the nature of singularity. <i>Singular behavior.</i>
<u>staggering</u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The amount of money required was staggering.</i>
<u>star</u>	Indicating the most important performer or role. <i>The starring role.</i>
starring	Denoting a principal role or performer in a film, play, or other show. <i>The starring characters were Fatty and Fudge.</i>
stunning	Extremely impressive or attractive. <i>A stunning detonation with volumes of black smoke.</i>
wonderful	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>The climate was wonderful all the year round.</i>

aquarius	(astrology) a person who is born while the sun is in Aquarius.
aries	(astrology) a person who is born while the sun is in Aries.
<u>asterisk</u>	Mark with an asterisk. <i>He had asterisked the things about the case that still bothered him.</i>
<u>astral</u>	Relating to or resembling the stars. <i>An astral body.</i>
astrologer	A person who uses astrology to tell others about their character or to predict their future. <i>He was advised by astrologers to delay his departure.</i>

<u>astrology</u>	The study of the movements and relative positions of celestial bodies interpreted as having an influence on human affairs and the natural world.
astronomer	An expert in or student of astronomy.
<u>astronomical</u>	Relating or belonging to the science of astronomy. <i>Astronomical observations.</i>
astronomy	The branch of physics that studies celestial bodies and the universe as a whole.
capricorn	A faint zodiacal constellation in the southern hemisphere; between Sagittarius and Aquarius.
<u>constellation</u>	A group of stars forming a recognizable pattern that is traditionally named after its apparent form or identified with a mythological figure. <i>No two patients ever show exactly the same constellation of symptoms.</i>
<u>cosmic</u>	Of or from or pertaining to or characteristic of the cosmos or universe. <i>The cosmic void.</i>
cosmogony	The branch of astrophysics that studies the origin and evolution and structure of the universe. <i>In their cosmogony the world was thought to be a square flat surface.</i>
<u>cosmos</u>	Any of various mostly Mexican herbs of the genus <i>Cosmos</i> having radiate heads of variously colored flowers and pinnate leaves; popular fall-blooming annuals. <i>He sat staring deep into the void reminding himself of man's place in the cosmos.</i>
<u>galaxy</u>	The galaxy of which the solar system is a part the Milky Way. <i>The four musicians have played with a galaxy of stars.</i>
horoscope	A forecast of a person's future, typically including a delineation of character and circumstances, based on the relative positions of the stars and planets at the time of that person's birth. <i>He gave lectures on astrology and cast horoscopes in his spare time.</i>
libra	The seventh sign of the zodiac; the sun is in this sign from about September 23 to October 22.
lunar	Of or relating to or associated with the moon. <i>A lunar eclipse.</i>
macrocosm	The whole of a complex structure, especially the world or the universe, contrasted with a small or representative part of it.
nebula	(pathology) a faint cloudy spot on the cornea.
observatory	A building designed and equipped to observe astronomical phenomena.

planetarium	An optical device for projecting images of celestial bodies and other astronomical phenomena onto the inner surface of a hemispherical dome.
planetary	Relating to the earth as a planet. <i>The laws of planetary motion.</i>
sidereal	Determined by daily motion of the stars.
spaceman	An astronaut.
<u>star</u>	Be the star in a performance. <i>His golf destiny was written in the stars.</i>
supernova	A star that explodes and becomes extremely luminous in the process.
telescope	Crush together or collapse. <i>In the accident the cars telescoped.</i>
<u>universe</u>	All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago. <i>They study the evolution of the universe.</i>
virgo	A person who is born while the sun is in Virgo.
