Associations of "Stick out" (30 Words)

adhere	Be a devoted follower or supporter. <i>Will this wallpaper adhere to the wall.</i>
bethink	Come to think. <i>He bethought himself of the verse from the Book of Proverbs.</i>
branch	A part of a forked or branching shape. <i>A branch of mathematics called graph theory.</i>
drill	Make a hole in or through something by using a drill. <i>Language learning drills.</i>
hornet	Large stinging paper wasp.
impale	(of a coat of arms) adjoin (another coat of arms) on the same shield. <i>The enemies were impaled and left to die.</i>
nudge	Approach (an age, figure, or level) very closely. <i>He gave her shoulder a nudge.</i>
offshoot	A thing that develops from something else. <i>Commercial offshoots of universities.</i>
pang	A sudden sharp feeling. <i>A pang of conscience.</i>
perforate	Perforated. <i>Perforate the sheets of paper.</i>
pierce	Cut or make a way through. <i>The cold pierced her bones.</i>
poke	Prod and stir a fire with a poker to make it burn more fiercely. <i>He poked Benny in the ribs and pointed.</i>
punch	Drive forcibly as if by a punch. <i>I punched the button to summon the lift.</i>
pushing	The act of applying force in order to move something away. <i>The pushing is good exercise.</i>

slot	Place an object into a slot typically one specifically designed to receive it. <i>Slot a television program.</i>
spiny	Difficult to understand or handle. <i>A spiny cactus.</i>
stab	A wound made by stabbing. <i>Impatient stabs of his finger.</i>
stake	Tie or fasten to a stake. <i>Stake out the path.</i>
sticker	An adhesive label or notice, generally printed or illustrated. <i>A disabled sticker for our car.</i>
sting	Wound or pierce with a sting. <i>She felt the sharp sting of tears behind her eyelids.</i>
thatch	Cover with thatch. <i>Scarify the lawn to remove debris and thatch.</i>
thorn	A thorny bush shrub or tree especially a hawthorn. <i>The issue has become a thorn in renewing the peace talks.</i>
twig	Branch out in a twiglike manner. <i>The lightning bolt twigged in several directions.</i>
twinge	(of a part of the body) suffer a sudden, sharp localized pain. <i>Twinges of conscience.</i>
wasp	A solitary winged insect with a narrow waist mostly distantly related to the social wasps and including many parasitic kinds.
wattle	Build of or with wattle.
wedge	A heel on a wedge shoe. <i>A wedge of cheese.</i>
