## Associations of "Stick to" (30 Words)

<a href="#">adhere</a>	Stick fast to (a surface or substance. <i>Will this wallpaper <b>adhere</b> to the wall.</i>
<a href="#">branch</a>	Of a tree or plant bear or send out branches. <i>This rose has a tendency to <b>branch</b> and spread at the top.</i>
<a href="#">drill</a>	Similar to the mandrill but smaller and less brightly colored. <i>BP has been licensed to <b>drill</b> for oil in the area.</i>
<a href="#">impale</a>	Display (a coat of arms) side by side with another on the same shield, separated by a vertical line. <i>His head was <b>impaled</b> on a pike and exhibited for all to see.</i>
<a href="#">knife</a>	Use a knife on. <i>A shard of steel <b>knifed</b> through the mainsail.</i>
<a href="#">nudge</a>	Push into action by pestering or annoying gently. <i>She appreciated the <b>nudge</b> to her memory.</i>
<a href="#">pang</a>	A sudden sharp pain or painful emotion. <i>A <b>pang</b> of conscience.</i>
<a href="#">perforate</a>	Perforated. <i>The walls will be <b>perforated</b> with thousands of circular openings.</i>
<a href="#">pierce</a>	Force a way through; penetrate. <i>The needle <b>pierced</b> her flesh.</i>
<a href="#">pin</a>	Attach or fasten with pins or as if with pins. <i>She was standing <b>pinned</b> against the door.</i>
<a href="#">poke</a>	Poke or thrust abruptly. <i>He <b>poked</b> Benny in the ribs and pointed.</i>
<a href="#">prickle</a>	A small spine or pointed outgrowth on the skin of certain animals. <i>Kathleen felt a <b>prickle</b> of excitement.</i>
<a href="#">prickly</a>	(of a person) ready to take offence. <i>This is a <b>prickly</b> subject.</i>

- pushing** The act of applying force in order to move something away.  
*The **pushing** is good exercise.*
- shove** The act of shoving (giving a push to someone or something).  
*I should have told the boss to **shove** it.*
- spike** Bring forth a spike or spikes.  
*The second baseman sharpened his **spikes** before every game.*
- spiny** Having or covered with protective barbs or quills or spines or thorns or setae etc.  
*A **spiny** cactus.*
- stab** Stab or pierce.  
*A stitch **stabbed** at her side.*
- stake** A pole or stake set up to mark something as the start or end of a race track.  
*Bishop Ridley was burned at the **stake**.*
- sticker** A small sharp-pointed tip resembling a spike on a stem or leaf.  
*A disabled **sticker** for our car.*
- sting** A painful wound caused by the thrust of an insect's stinger into skin.  
*She smiled to take the **sting** out of her words.*
- thatch** Hair resembling thatched roofing material.  
*The rain drummed noisily on the **thatch** above her head.*
- thorn** A thorny bush shrub or tree especially a hawthorn.  
*The issue has become a **thorn** in renewing the peace talks.*
- twig** Branch out in a twiglike manner.  
*Cutaneous nerve **twigs**.*
- twinge** A brief experience of an emotion, typically an unpleasant one.  
*Stop the exercises if the tummy **twinges**.*
- wattle** Any of various Australasian trees yielding slender poles suitable for wattle.
- wedge** Fix in position using a wedge.  
*Davies hit a **wedge** to within a yard of the hole.*
