lifelessness	Not having life.
motionlessness	The state or condition of being motionless, lack of motion; inactivity, inertness. <i>The utter motionlessness of a marble statue.</i>
still	A plant and works where alcoholic drinks are made by distillation. <i>He wanted some stills for a magazine ad.</i>
windlessness	An opening in a wall or screen that admits light and air and through which customers can be served.

- Absolute stillness greeted our gaze.

acquiesce	Accept something reluctantly but without protest. Sara acquiesce d in his decision.
acquiescence	Acceptance without protest. A murmur of acquiescence from the assembly.
calm	Become quiet or calm especially after a state of agitation. <i>Calm seas.</i>
calming	The act of appeasing (as by acceding to the demands of.
<u>calmness</u>	The state or condition of being free from disturbance or violent activity. <i>This relative calmness ended at around 7 a m when the wind picked up speed.</i>
composure	Steadiness of mind under stress. She was struggling to regain her composure .
equanimity	Calmness and composure, especially in a difficult situation. <i>He accepted their problems with composure and she with equanimity.</i>



halcyon	Denoting a period of time in the past that was idyllically happy and peaceful. The halcyon days of the mid 1980s when profits were soaring.
<u>hush</u>	Make (someone) be quiet or stop talking. Management took steps to hush up the dangers.
meditation	The action or practice of meditating. A life of meditation .
nonviolence	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
pacific	Peaceful in character or intent. The result of this pacific policy was that no troops were called up.
peace	A treaty agreeing peace between warring states. Peace came on November 11th.
peaceful	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. They settle their disputes by peaceful means.
<u>placid</u>	Not easily upset or excited. A ribbon of sand between the angry sea and the placid bay.
quiescent	(pathology) causing no symptoms. A quiescent tumor.
quiet	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. The street below was quiet little traffic braving the snow.
quietness	The fact or state of abstaining from speech. Grandpa s sudden quietness was disconcerting.
quietude	A state of peace and quiet. It highlights her quietude and wise passivity.
repose	Put or confide something in a person or thing. <i>He had lost none of his grace or his repose.</i>
<u>restful</u>	Affording physical or mental rest. The rooms were cool and restful .
reticence	The trait of being uncommunicative; not volunteering anything more than necessary. The traditional emotional reticence of the British.
secretiveness	The trait of keeping things secret.
<u>serene</u>	Calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil. <i>Serene</i> certainty.
<u>serenity</u>	The state of being calm, peaceful, and untroubled. An oasis of serenity amidst the bustling city.



silence	Cause to be quiet or not talk. She was silence d by the officer s stern look.
<u>tranquil</u>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. <i>Her tranquil gaze.</i>
<u>tranquility</u>	A disposition free from stress or emotion.
tranquilize	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to.
tranquillity	An untroubled state; free from disturbances. Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the tranquillity of rural life.
