apparent	Clearly visible or understood; obvious. <i>The committee investigated some apparent discrepancies.</i>
approve	Believe that someone or something is good or acceptable. <i>He approved himself ripe for military command.</i>
assured	Confident. <i>She paints with an assured hand.</i>
assuredly	Confidently. <i>The lad kept his cool and assuredly slipped the ball between the posts.</i>
avowal	A statement asserting the existence or the truth of something.
certainly	Definitely or positively (‘sure’ is sometimes used informally for ‘surely’). <i>The prestigious address certainly adds to the firm’s appeal.</i>
clear	Make free from confusion or ambiguity make clear. <i>As clear as a whistle.</i>
clearly	In an intelligible manner. <i>On white paper the seeds are clearly visible.</i>
constitution	The constitution written at the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia in 1787 and subsequently ratified by the original thirteen states. <i>Britain lacks a codified constitution.</i>
decidedly	In a decisive and confident way. <i>It was decidedly too expensive.</i>
decisively	With finality; conclusively. <i>I want the person who wins the election to win decisively.</i>
declared	Declared as fact explicitly stated. <i>Their declared and their covert objectives.</i>
definitely	Without doubt (used for emphasis). <i>I shall definitely be at the airport to meet you.</i>

doubtless	Certainly; without doubt. <i>Doubtless you ll solve the problem.</i>
explicitly	In an explicit manner. <i>Explicitly erotic images.</i>
expressly	With specific intentions; for the express purpose. <i>The house was expressly built for entertaining.</i>
indubitable	Impossible to doubt; unquestionable. <i>An indubitable truth.</i>
indubitably	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>It was immediately and indubitably apparent that I had interrupted a scene of lovers.</i>
obvious	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>Obvious errors.</i>
overt	Open and observable; not secret or hidden. <i>Overt hostility.</i>
ratification	Making something valid by formally ratifying or confirming it. <i>The ratification of the treaty.</i>
ratify	Approve and express assent, responsibility, or obligation. <i>Both countries were due to ratify the treaty by the end of the year.</i>
specify	Specify as a condition or requirement in a contract or agreement make an express demand or provision in an agreement. <i>The coup leader promised an election but did not specify a date.</i>
stated	Declared as fact explicitly stated. <i>Do not exceed the stated dose.</i>
surely	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>If there is no will then surely the house goes automatically to you.</i>
treaty	A formally concluded and ratified agreement between states. <i>The two Presidents signed a ten year treaty of solidarity.</i>
unambiguous	Not open to more than one interpretation. <i>Instructions should be unambiguous.</i>
undoubtedly	Without doubt; certainly. <i>They are undoubtedly guilty.</i>
unequivocal	Admitting of no doubt or misunderstanding; having only one meaning or interpretation and leading to only one conclusion. <i>An unequivocal or univocal statement.</i>
unquestionably	In a way that cannot be disputed or doubted; without question. <i>Fred Winter is unquestionably the jockey to follow.</i>
