## Associations of "Stipulated" (30 Words)

<a href="#">apparent</a>	Clearly visible or understood; obvious. <i>The committee investigated some <b>apparent</b> discrepancies.</i>
approve	Believe that someone or something is good or acceptable. <i>He <b>approved</b> himself ripe for military command.</i>
assured	Confident. <i>She paints with an <b>assured</b> hand.</i>
<a href="#">assuredly</a>	Confidently. <i>The lad kept his cool and <b>assuredly</b> slipped the ball between the posts.</i>
avowal	A statement asserting the existence or the truth of something.
<a href="#">certainly</a>	Definitely or positively (‘sure’ is sometimes used informally for ‘surely’). <i>The prestigious address <b>certainly</b> adds to the firm’s appeal.</i>
<a href="#">clear</a>	Make free from confusion or ambiguity make clear. <i>As <b>clear</b> as a whistle.</i>
clearly	In an intelligible manner. <i>On white paper the seeds are <b>clearly</b> visible.</i>
<a href="#">constitution</a>	The constitution written at the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia in 1787 and subsequently ratified by the original thirteen states. <i>Britain lacks a codified <b>constitution</b>.</i>
decidedly	In a decisive and confident way. <i>It was <b>decidedly</b> too expensive.</i>
decisively	With finality; conclusively. <i>I want the person who wins the election to win <b>decisively</b>.</i>
declared	Declared as fact explicitly stated. <i>Their <b>declared</b> and their covert objectives.</i>
definitely	Without doubt (used for emphasis). <i>I shall <b>definitely</b> be at the airport to meet you.</i>

<b>doubtless</b>	Certainly; without doubt. <i><b>Doubtless</b> you ll solve the problem.</i>
<b>explicitly</b>	In an explicit manner. <i><b>Explicitly</b> erotic images.</i>
<b>expressly</b>	With specific intentions; for the express purpose. <i>The house was <b>expressly</b> built for entertaining.</i>
<b>indubitable</b>	Impossible to doubt; unquestionable. <i>An <b>indubitable</b> truth.</i>
<b>indubitably</b>	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>It was immediately and <b>indubitably</b> apparent that I had interrupted a scene of lovers.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i><b>Obvious</b> errors.</i>
<b>overt</b>	Open and observable; not secret or hidden. <i><b>Overt</b> hostility.</i>
<b>ratification</b>	Making something valid by formally ratifying or confirming it. <i>The <b>ratification</b> of the treaty.</i>
<b>ratify</b>	Approve and express assent, responsibility, or obligation. <i>Both countries were due to <b>ratify</b> the treaty by the end of the year.</i>
<b>specify</b>	Specify as a condition or requirement in a contract or agreement make an express demand or provision in an agreement. <i>The coup leader promised an election but did not <b>specify</b> a date.</i>
<b>stated</b>	Declared as fact explicitly stated. <i>Do not exceed the <b>stated</b> dose.</i>
<b>surely</b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>If there is no will then <b>surely</b> the house goes automatically to you.</i>
<b>treaty</b>	A formally concluded and ratified agreement between states. <i>The two Presidents signed a ten year <b>treaty</b> of solidarity.</i>
<b>unambiguous</b>	Not open to more than one interpretation. <i>Instructions should be <b>unambiguous</b>.</i>
<b>undoubtedly</b>	Without doubt; certainly. <i>They are <b>undoubtedly</b> guilty.</i>
<b>unequivocal</b>	Admitting of no doubt or misunderstanding; having only one meaning or interpretation and leading to only one conclusion. <i>An <b>unequivocal</b> or univocal statement.</i>
<b>unquestionably</b>	In a way that cannot be disputed or doubted; without question. <i>Fred Winter is <b>unquestionably</b> the jockey to follow.</i>
