indubitable Impossible to doubt; unquestionable.

An **indubitable** truth.

In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted.

**obvious** Predictable and lacking in subtlety.

**Obvious** errors.

overt Open and observable; not secret or hidden.

**Overt** hostility.

ratification Making something valid by formally ratifying or confirming it.

The **ratification** of the treaty.

ratify
Approve and express assent, responsibility, or obligation.

Both countries were due to **ratify** the treaty by the end of the year.

Specify as a condition or requirement in a contract or agreement make an

**specify** express demand or provision in an agreement.

The coup leader promised an election but did not **specify** a date.

**stated** Declared as fact explicitly stated.

Do not exceed the **stated** dose.

Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely.

If there is no will then **surely** the house goes automatically to you.

treaty

A formally concluded and ratified agreement between states.

The two Presidents signed a ten year **treaty** of solidarity.

unambiguous Not open to more than one interpretation.

*Instructions should be* **unambiguous**.

undoubtedly Without doubt; certainly.

They are **undoubtedly** guilty.

Admitting of no doubt or misunderstanding; having only one meaning or

**unequivocal** interpretation and leading to only one conclusion.

An **unequivocal** or univocal statement.

**unquestionably** In a way that cannot be disputed or doubted; without question.

Fred Winter is **unquestionably** the jockey to follow.
