| assured                      | Confident.<br><i>She paints with an <b>assured</b> hand.</i>   |

| avowal                       | A statement asserting the existence or the truth of something.   |
| <a href="#">certainly</a>    | Definitely or positively (‘sure’ is sometimes used informally for ‘surely’).<br><i>The prestigious address <b>certainly</b> adds to the firm’s appeal.</i>   |
| <a href="#">clear</a>        | Make free from confusion or ambiguity make clear.<br><i>As <b>clear</b> as a whistle.</i>  |
| clearly                      | In an intelligible manner.<br><i>On white paper the seeds are <b>clearly</b> visible.</i>  |
| <a href="#">constitution</a> | The constitution written at the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia in 1787 and subsequently ratified by the original thirteen states.<br><i>Britain lacks a codified <b>constitution</b>.</i> |
| decidedly                    | In a decisive and confident way.<br><i>It was <b>decidedly</b> too expensive.</i>  |
| decisively                   | With finality; conclusively.<br><i>I want the person who wins the election to win <b>decisively</b>.</i>   |
| declared                     | Declared as fact explicitly stated.<br><i>Their <b>declared</b> and their covert objectives.</i>   |
| definitely                   | Without doubt (used for emphasis).<br><i>I shall <b>definitely</b> be at the airport to meet you.</i>  |

| <b>doubtless</b>      | Certainly; without doubt.<br><i><b>Doubtless</b> you ll solve the problem.</i>  |
| <b>explicitly</b>     | In an explicit manner.<br><i><b>Explicitly</b> erotic images.</i>   |
| <b>expressly</b>      | With specific intentions; for the express purpose.<br><i>The house was <b>expressly</b> built for entertaining.</i>   |
| <b>indubitable</b>    | Impossible to doubt; unquestionable.<br><i>An <b>indubitable</b> truth.</i>   |
| <b>indubitably</b>    | In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted.<br><i>It was immediately and <b>indubitably</b> apparent that I had interrupted a scene of lovers.</i>  |
| <b>obvious</b>        | Predictable and lacking in subtlety.<br><i><b>Obvious</b> errors.</i>   |
| <b>overt</b>          | Open and observable; not secret or hidden.<br><i><b>Overt</b> hostility.</i>  |
| <b>ratification</b>   | Making something valid by formally ratifying or confirming it.<br><i>The <b>ratification</b> of the treaty.</i>   |
| <b>ratify</b>         | Approve and express assent, responsibility, or obligation.<br><i>Both countries were due to <b>ratify</b> the treaty by the end of the year.</i>  |
| <b>specify</b>        | Specify as a condition or requirement in a contract or agreement make an express demand or provision in an agreement.<br><i>The coup leader promised an election but did not <b>specify</b> a date.</i> |
| <b>stated</b>         | Declared as fact explicitly stated.<br><i>Do not exceed the <b>stated</b> dose.</i>   |
| <b>surely</b>         | Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely.<br><i>If there is no will then <b>surely</b> the house goes automatically to you.</i>  |
| <b>treaty</b>         | A formally concluded and ratified agreement between states.<br><i>The two Presidents signed a ten year <b>treaty</b> of solidarity.</i>   |
| <b>unambiguous</b>    | Not open to more than one interpretation.<br><i>Instructions should be <b>unambiguous</b>.</i>  |
| <b>undoubtedly</b>    | Without doubt; certainly.<br><i>They are <b>undoubtedly</b> guilty.</i>   |
| <b>unequivocal</b>    | Admitting of no doubt or misunderstanding; having only one meaning or interpretation and leading to only one conclusion.<br><i>An <b>unequivocal</b> or univocal statement.</i>                         |
| <b>unquestionably</b> | In a way that cannot be disputed or doubted; without question.<br><i>Fred Winter is <b>unquestionably</b> the jockey to follow.</i>   |
