Definitions of "Stipulation" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “stipulation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A condition or requirement that is specified or demanded as part of an agreement.*
- *An agreement or concession made by parties in a judicial proceeding (or by their attorneys) relating to the business before the court; must be in writing unless they are part of the court record.*
- *An assumption on which rests the validity or effect of something else.*
- *(law) an agreement or concession made by parties in a judicial proceeding (or by their attorneys) relating to the business before the court; must be in writing unless they are part of the court record.*
- *A restriction that is insisted upon as a condition for an agreement.*

precondition	An assumption on which rests the validity or effect of something else. <i>A precondition for peace.</i>
<u>prerequisite</u>	Something that is required in advance. <i>Sponsorship is not a prerequisite for any of our courses.</i>
provision	The cognitive process of thinking about what you will do in the event of something happening. <i>Changing levels of transport provision.</i>
proviso	A condition or qualification attached to an agreement or statement. <i>He let his house with the proviso that his own staff should remain to run it.</i>
requisite	A thing that is necessary for the achievement of a specified end. <i>She believed privacy to be a requisite for a peaceful life.</i>

specification *One of the telescope s mirrors had been manufactured to incorrect specifications.*

healthiness	The state of being vigorous and free from bodily or mental disease.
juridical	Relating to judicial proceedings and the administration of the law. <i>Juridical days.</i>
level	Make level or straight. <i>Woods sliced the ball into the net to level the score.</i>
<u>milieu</u>	The environmental condition. <i>Gregory came from the same aristocratic milieu as Sidonius.</i>
<u>phenomenon</u>	A fact or situation that is observed to exist or happen, especially one whose cause or explanation is in question. <i>The band was a pop phenomenon just for their sales figures alone.</i>
<u>prerequisite</u>	A thing that is required as a prior condition for something else to happen or exist. <i>Latin was a prerequisite for admission.</i>
<u>prestige</u>	Denoting something that arouses widespread respect or admiration. <i>The firm has recently gained considerable prestige.</i>
procedure	A particular course of action intended to achieve a result. <i>The police are now reviewing procedures.</i>
proviso	A condition or qualification attached to an agreement or statement. <i>He let his house with the proviso that his own staff should remain to run it.</i>
qualification	The qualification stage of a sporting event. <i>The five year residency qualification for presidential candidates.</i>
rule	A rule describing or prescribing a linguistic practice. <i>An industrial tribunal ruled that he was unfairly dismissed from his job.</i>

semiconscious	Partially conscious; not completely aware of sensations.
setting	A piece of metal in which a precious stone or gem is fixed to form a piece of jewellery. <i>A place setting of sterling flatware.</i>
specification	A detailed description of the design and materials used to make something. <i>There was no clear specification of objectives.</i>
<u>specify</u>	Specify as a condition or requirement in a contract or agreement make an express demand or provision in an agreement. <i>The agency failed to specify that the workers were not their employees.</i>
status	High rank or social standing. <i>Those who enjoy wealth and status.</i>
surroundings	The things and conditions around a person or thing. <i>I took up the time admiring my surroundings.</i>
thermostat	Control the temperature with a thermostat.
unperturbed	Not perturbed or concerned. <i>Kenneth seems unperturbed by the news.</i>
wellness	The state of being in good health, especially as an actively pursued goal. <i>A healthcare system focused on wellness not sickness.</i>
