- An assumption on which rests the validity or effect of something else.
- (law) an agreement or concession made by parties in a judicial proceeding (or by their attorneys) relating to the business before the court; must be in writing unless they are part of the court record.
- A restriction that is insisted upon as a condition for an agreement.

procedure	A particular course of action intended to achieve a result. The police are now reviewing <b>procedure</b> s.
proviso	A condition or qualification attached to an agreement or statement. <i>He let his house with the <b>proviso</b> that his own staff should remain to run it.</i>
qualification	The qualification stage of a sporting event. The five year residency <b>qualification</b> for presidential candidates.
rule	A rule describing or prescribing a linguistic practice. An industrial tribunal <b>rule</b> d that he was unfairly dismissed from his job.
