### Definitions of "Stipulation" as a noun

- *A condition or requirement that is specified or demanded as part of an agreement.*
- *An agreement or concession made by parties in a judicial proceeding (or by their attorneys) relating to the business before the court; must be in writing unless they are part of the court record.*
- *An assumption on which rests the validity or effect of something else.*
- *(law) an agreement or concession made by parties in a judicial proceeding (or by their attorneys) relating to the business before the court; must be in writing unless they are part of the court record.*
- *A restriction that is insisted upon as a condition for an agreement.*

<b>requisite</b>	A thing that is necessary for the achievement of a specified end. <i>She believed privacy to be a <b>requisite</b> for a peaceful life.</i>

<b>explanation</b>	The act of explaining; making something plain or intelligible. <i>My application was rejected without <b>explanation</b>.</i>
<b>explicitly</b>	In an explicit manner. <i>She has <b>explicitly</b> rejected the theory of patriarchy.</i>
<b>healthiness</b>	The state of being vigorous and free from bodily or mental disease.
<b>juridical</b>	Relating to judicial proceedings and the administration of the law. <i><b>Juridical</b> days.</i>
<b>level</b>	Make level or straight. <i>Woods sliced the ball into the net to <b>level</b> the score.</i>
<b><u>milieu</u></b>	The environmental condition. <i>Gregory came from the same aristocratic <b>milieu</b> as Sidonius.</i>
<b><u>phenomenon</u></b>	A fact or situation that is observed to exist or happen, especially one whose cause or explanation is in question. <i>The band was a pop <b>phenomenon</b> just for their sales figures alone.</i>
<b><u>prerequisite</u></b>	A thing that is required as a prior condition for something else to happen or exist. <i>Latin was a <b>prerequisite</b> for admission.</i>
<b><u>prestige</u></b>	Denoting something that arouses widespread respect or admiration. <i>The firm has recently gained considerable <b>prestige</b>.</i>
<b>procedure</b>	A particular course of action intended to achieve a result. <i>The police are now reviewing <b>procedures</b>.</i>
<b>proviso</b>	A condition or qualification attached to an agreement or statement. <i>He let his house with the <b>proviso</b> that his own staff should remain to run it.</i>
<b>qualification</b>	The qualification stage of a sporting event. <i>The five year residency <b>qualification</b> for presidential candidates.</i>
<b>rule</b>	A rule describing or prescribing a linguistic practice. <i>An industrial tribunal <b>ruled</b> that he was unfairly dismissed from his job.</i>

<b>semiconscious</b>	Partially conscious; not completely aware of sensations.
<b>setting</b>	A piece of metal in which a precious stone or gem is fixed to form a piece of jewellery. <i>A place <b>setting</b> of sterling flatware.</i>
<b>specification</b>	A detailed description of the design and materials used to make something. <i>There was no clear <b>specification</b> of objectives.</i>
<a href="#"><u>specify</u></a>	Specify as a condition or requirement in a contract or agreement make an express demand or provision in an agreement. <i>The agency failed to <b>specify</b> that the workers were not their employees.</i>
<b>status</b>	High rank or social standing. <i>Those who enjoy wealth and <b>status</b>.</i>
<b>surroundings</b>	The things and conditions around a person or thing. <i>I took up the time admiring my <b>surroundings</b>.</i>
<b>thermostat</b>	Control the temperature with a thermostat.
<b>unperturbed</b>	Not perturbed or concerned. <i>Kenneth seems <b>unperturbed</b> by the news.</i>
<b>wellness</b>	The state of being in good health, especially as an actively pursued goal. <i>A healthcare system focused on <b>wellness</b> not sickness.</i>
