Associations of "Stock in trade" (30 Words)

<u>barter</u>	Goods or services used in bartering. <i>I took a supply of coffee and cigarettes to use as barter.</i>
budget	Provide a sum of money for a particular purpose from a budget. <i>The president submitted the annual budget to Congress.</i>
business	Business concerns collectively. <i>Government and business could not agree.</i>
<u>commerce</u>	The United States federal department that promotes and administers domestic and foreign trade (including management of the census and the patent office); created in 1913. <i>The noise and warmth of human commerce.</i>
consignee	The person to whom merchandise is delivered over.
consignment	Goods carried by a large vehicle. <i>Levels of consignment are running below budget.</i>
consignor	The person who delivers over or commits merchandise.
courier	Send goods or documents by courier. <i>A courier service.</i>
credit	Accounting enter as credit. <i>This deferred tax can be credited to the profit and loss account.</i>
dealing	Method or manner of conduct in relation to others. <i>He has always been honest in his dealings with me.</i>
<u>deficit</u>	The score by which a team or individual is losing. <i>They have serious linguistic deficits.</i>
<u>emporium</u>	A centre of commerce; a market.
<u>export</u>	Of a high standard suitable for export. <i>The export of Western technology.</i>

exporter	A person, country, or company that sends goods or services to another country for sale. <i>Japan has only begun to be an exporter of culture in the last couple of decades.</i>
freight	A charge for transport by freight. <i>A bill indicating that the freight has been paid.</i>
<u>hype</u>	A deception carried out for the sake of publicity. <i>Is his comeback a hype.</i>
importer	A person or organization that brings goods or services into a country from abroad for sale. <i>The EU is the largest importer of agricultural products from developing countries.</i>
marketing	The action or business of promoting and selling products or services, including market research and advertising. <i>The Western arts of marketing and distribution.</i>
merchandise	Branded products used to promote a film, pop group, etc., or linked to a fictional character; merchandising. <i>Anyone who is not of that Guild may not merchandise with them.</i>
sell	Sell all of one's property possessions or assets. <i>These books sell like hot cakes.</i>
shipment	The act of sending off something. <i>Logs waiting for shipment.</i>
shipper	A company in the business of shipping freight.
shop	Shop around not necessarily buying. <i>She pointed to the classroom ceiling I live here over the shop.</i>
shopper	A bag for holding shopping, that is attached to wheels and pushed or pulled along. <i>A commercial centre thronged with shoppers.</i>
shopworn	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. <i>He brought out some shopworn lettuce.</i>
<u>store</u>	Have a supply of (something useful). <i>Her vast store of knowledge.</i>
<u>threadbare</u>	(of an argument, excuse, idea, etc.) used so often that it is no longer effective. <i>The song was a tissue of threadbare clichés.</i>
timeworn	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. <i>Parroting some timeworn axiom.</i>
trader	A person who buys and sells goods, currency, or shares.

Offer (small items) for sale, either from a stall or from a slot machine.
